## Premier Oliver And Prince Rupert.

Frequently we hear of Premier Oliver making trips up the E. & N. Railway and telling the world of the wonderful things he has seen along that route, but it is now well over two years since he has been up this way. He has not visited this centre since he became Premier.

While we all know that the E. & N. Railway is one of the Government's burdensome babies which it had to adopt when it was left an orphan and which must be nursed, yet this country also has claims. We have seen several of the provincial ministers and they are always welcome here, but Honest John's face would look good once in a while.

There are many problems to be solved in this north country. The Minister of Lands, as our particular representative looks after our needs with care, and Alex. Manson, M. P. P., is on the watch for his own constituency, but at the same time we would like to have a visit occasionally from the head of the Government.

Now that this city is beginning to come into the eye of the world it would be worth while for the first minister to keep in touch with us. We are about to be doing things and we want him to know it and to give us a leg up occasionally in our climb to commercial supremacy. Also, we shall be able to help him if he only realizes it.

We are not jealous of the other parts of the country, but we do not intend to sit back and wait until someone hears of us. We are going to be right to the front and we want Mr. Oliver and the other members of his cabinet to know it. If they would only come up here occasionally we might let them know what a little town is like.

## Prince Rupert's Nearness to Orient.

The Victoria Daily Colonist prints a table of distances between coast points and Yokohama. From this list it is clear that Prince Rupert has a great advantage.

From the figures given it is shown that this port is 385 miles nearer Yokohama than Victoria and 465 miles nearer than Vancouver. A vessel steaming at 15 miles an hour would have a start of 31 hours going from this port rather than from Vancouver. That is a very material gain and one that cannot be impressed too often. As most freighters make only about ten to twelve knots the gain in time would be near two days.

## Need of Road Leading From City.

The need of a road leading out of Prince Rupert connecting with the Skeena River was made clear during the trip of the delegates that went up the river to meet Colonel Peck on Sunday. There is no communication at present except by water with Port Edward, with the canneries on the Skeena, with Smith Island, where a number of settlers are now going in and with the several fertile river valleys along the route, which would be used if there was communication.

Besides this there is the recreation idea. Prince Rupert is wholly shut in. There is probably no city in the world of her size so situated. It is not asking a favor to request that a road be constructed. Considering the income that is collected here, something of the sort is coming to the district.

If the Dominion Government is prepared to look after the fish docks, and it is understood that this will be done, the Provincial Government might turn its attention to roads, of which we have none.

We are aware that the Provincial Government is anxious to serve us. Here is the opportunity.

## LAND REGISTRY ACT.
