BUILDING OF HOUSES IS BEING COMMENCED

New Building Society Has Its Charter and is Ready for Business.

While the building program has been rather slow under the campaign which was put on recently to provide houses for those who are coming in, preparations are going ahead steadily. The charter for the new loan company has arrived and they are in a position to do business at once. There has been some delay owing to the time it takes to secure the proper documents of incorporation.

George H. Munro has the material on the ground for four houses and the piles driven for one. He will be going ahead with the work in a few days. The piles are driven for Fred Stork's new house in Section 2 and much of the lumber is on the ground. There are a number of other houses commencing and the prospect is that before very long a good deal of building will be under way.

STREET FIGHTING IN CITY OF NAPLES

Paris, May 13.—A battle occurred last night in the streets of Naples between liberated convicts and soldiers on one side and Gendarmes on the other. The soldiers and convicts defeated the gendarmes and captured the court house. The gendarmes were reinforced by a battalion of troops and order was restored after hours of fighting.

CREED IS WRONG SAYS PRESBYTERIAN PARSON

Rev. R. G. Stewart of Robertson church, stated at the opening of the Presbyterian Synod at Edmonton that to his personal knowledge there were as many retired ministers living in Edmonton as there were ministers in the active work of the Presbyterian church in the city. Under the present conditions he did not blame men for forsaking their calling. Some he said, no doubt, were out on account of physical conditions but others were out because of the unreasonable machinery of the church and because of an un-revised creed.

To get and hold young men in the ministry, he maintained that the church must adopt a creed that can be subscribed to without qualification or "mental reservation." It is time the General Assembly of the church summoned up courage enough to revise the creed of the church in keeping with the belief of the great majority of the ministers. More young men would be induced to take up the ministry if the creed of the church were such that they could accept it whole-heartedly.

GREAT BRITAIN GOT 111 GERMAN SHIPS

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.) London, May 13.—In the House of Commons Leslie Wilson stated that 22 German passenger ships of 168,889 tons and 89 cargo ships of 663,210 tons had been handed over to Great Britain.

PRINCE GEORGE VETS. TAKE EXCEPTION TO ALIEN LANGUAGES

Would Hear Nothing But English Spoken on Streets—Elect Officers for Year.

Prince George, May 14.—At their recent annual meeting the Great War Veterans elected officers for the coming year as follows:—President, Comrade Wimbles; Vice-President, Comrade Vibbard; Secretary, Comrade Fisher; Assistant Secretary, Comrade Mellson; Treasurer, Comrade Pooley.

Objection was taken at the meeting to the manner in which alien languages were used on the streets. The opinion was expressed that the returning men objected most strenuously to the use of any but the English language and that the local organization would not be responsible for disturbances when people were sufficiently indiscreet to use alien languages.

WATER ACT, 1914. RIPARIAN RIGHTS

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim. Such statements of claim shall be filed in duplicate with the Water Recorder of the Water District in which the water is diverted or used.
After the first day of June, 1920, no right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose shall exist by virtue only of any ownership of land. Forms of statement of claim can be obtained from the Water Recorders of the several Water Districts in the Province or from the Comptroller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C.

SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

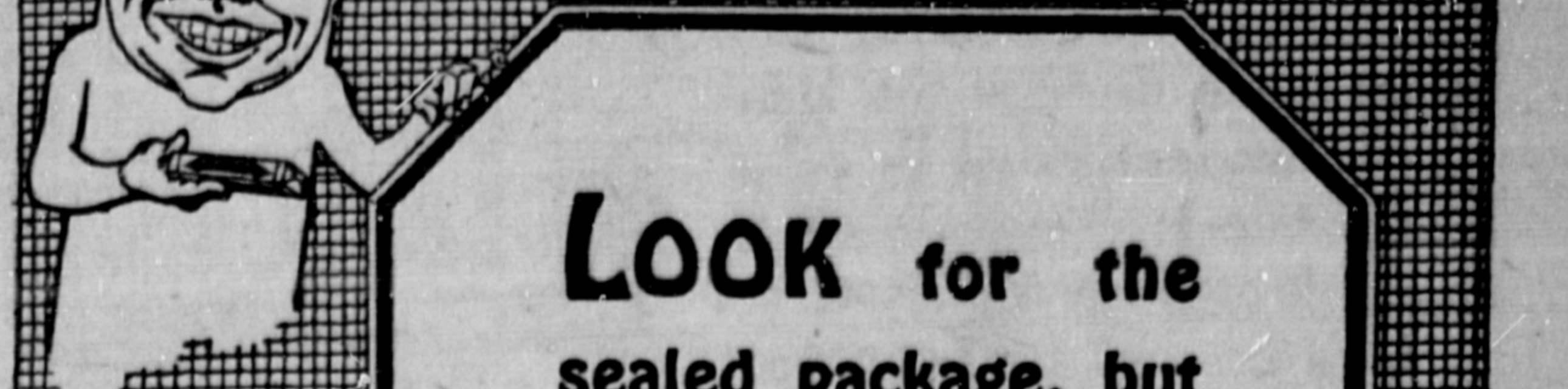
Pre-emption now confined to surveyed land only.
Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.
Partitions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.
Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.
Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.
Records without permanent residence may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$200 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.
Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.
Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.
For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.
PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.
The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the holder or devisee of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT.

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted agreements to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly. If it is not considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchaser from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the adjustment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 1st day of May, 1919. Any application made after this date will not be considered. These allotments apply to town lots and lands of the Crown sold as public auction.
