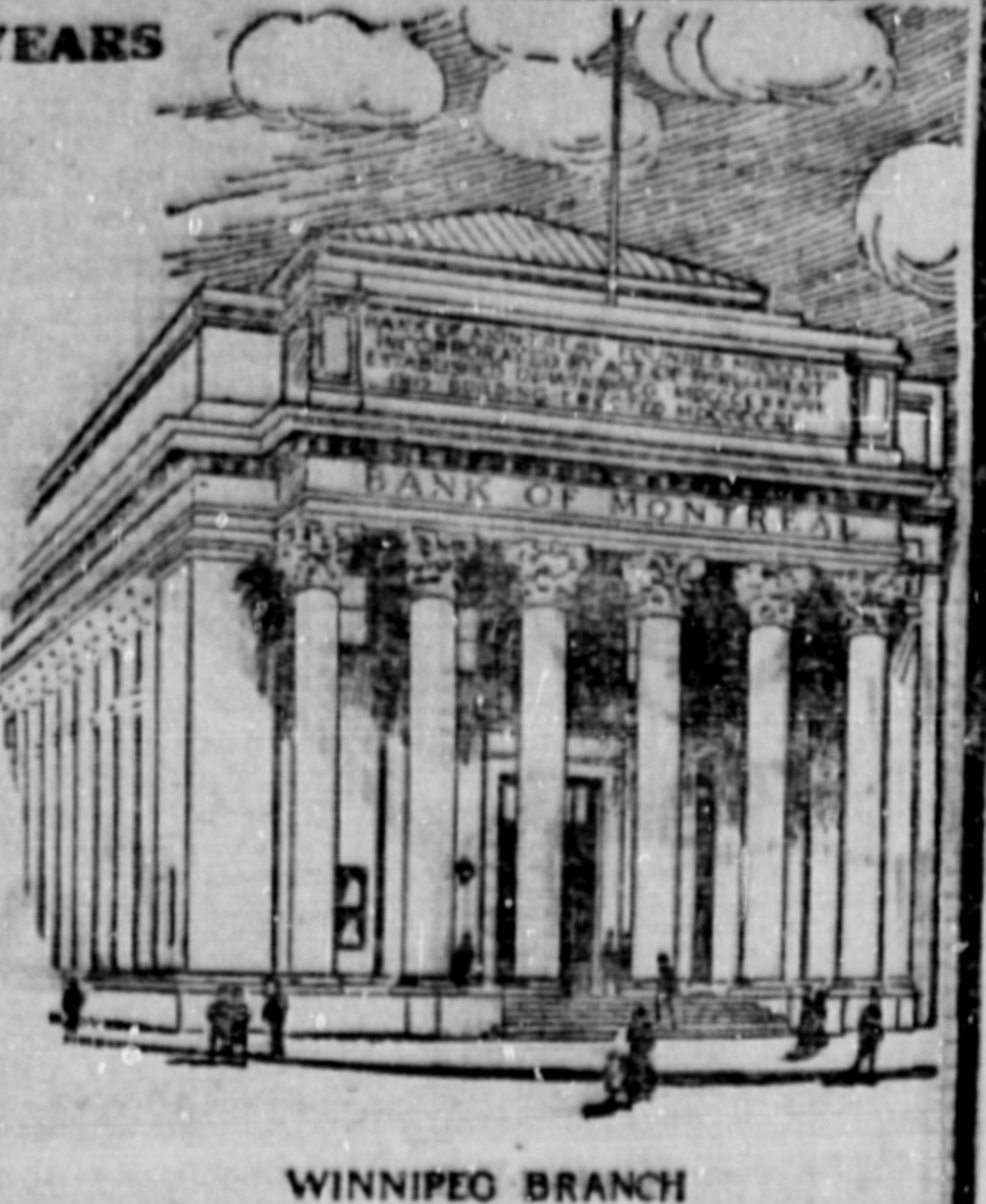

## LOW FISH PRICES DETER ENTERPRISE

Company Lay is Now More Profitable Than Share System.

There is a good deal of dissatisfaction among the fishermen at the low prices which are being paid for halibut. Many of them claim that they cannot make any money at 9c. a pound, the price which has been obtaining recently and as a result some of the boats have tied up.

Since the drop in price there has been a desire among the fishermen to secure positions on the company boats. When prices were high the share system was the best, but now there is more money under the "company lay."

The buyers claim that the eastern market is glutted and that the prices paid there are so low that it does not pay them to handle the fish.

## ADVISORY BOARD WILL MEET AT SMITHERS

As a result of suggestions advanced by F. M. Nourse, the district representative on the Advisory Board of Agriculture, that the next session be held at Smithers, and following an invitation by A. M. Manson, M. P., for Omineca, word has come that the Hon. E. D. Barrow, minister of agriculture, has consented to the plan, and it is expected the assembly will take place at Smithers about the middle of June, says the Interior News.

During the spring session of the board, Mr. Manson kept in close touch with proceedings, and naturally when it came to the holding of the next session he lost no time or occasion to advance the Bulkley Valley as the proper place.

Not only will members of the Advisory Board attend, but delegates from the Dairy Men's Association, Stock Breeders' Association, Horticultural Association and Poultry Association. Mr. Barrow is lending his keenest support to the matter and the board is getting in touch with the railway company with a view to obtaining special rates.

## WILLARD-DEMPESE CHAMPIONSHIP BOUT

## SPRUCE FOR JAPAN

Product of This District Will Be In Demand on Other Side of Ocean.

That there will be a demand for aeroplane spruce in Japan is the news conveyed by the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Yokohama. The Japanese while not as expert in the air as the British or Americans or French, yet are learning the game and many are becoming proficient. As a result they are about to launch a campaign of aeroplane building in order to interest their people in the new science.

British Columbia will supply most of the material for these planes and already inquiries are being made for British Columbia spruce.
