**BEARS WIN
IN ROWING**

Leanders Second in Olympic Water Event Yesterday and Still Have Chance For Finals

B. C. Men Lead

Pratt and DeMille of Vancouver Romp Home Ahead of Opponents in Two-Oared Rowing

LONG BEACH, Cal., August 11—The Golden Bears of California, in a dazzling sprint yesterday, defeated eight-oared crews from Canada, Germany and New Zealand in Olympic Games rowing. The Californians shot in front of the Leanders of Hamilton three hundred metres from the finish and defeated the Canadians by half a length. It was the second Canadian defeat. The Halifax Mic Macs, four-oared crew without a coxswain, lost by a slight margin in their heat to an Italian crew.

The Leanders and the Mic Macs are still in the running and will race with second position crews for the right to enter the final.

In the second eight-oared event, Italy sprang a surprise by defeating Great Britain, Japan and Brazil.

Pratt and DeMille, Vancouver doubles, romped to victory in the first heat with their Italian and Brazilian opponents outclassed.

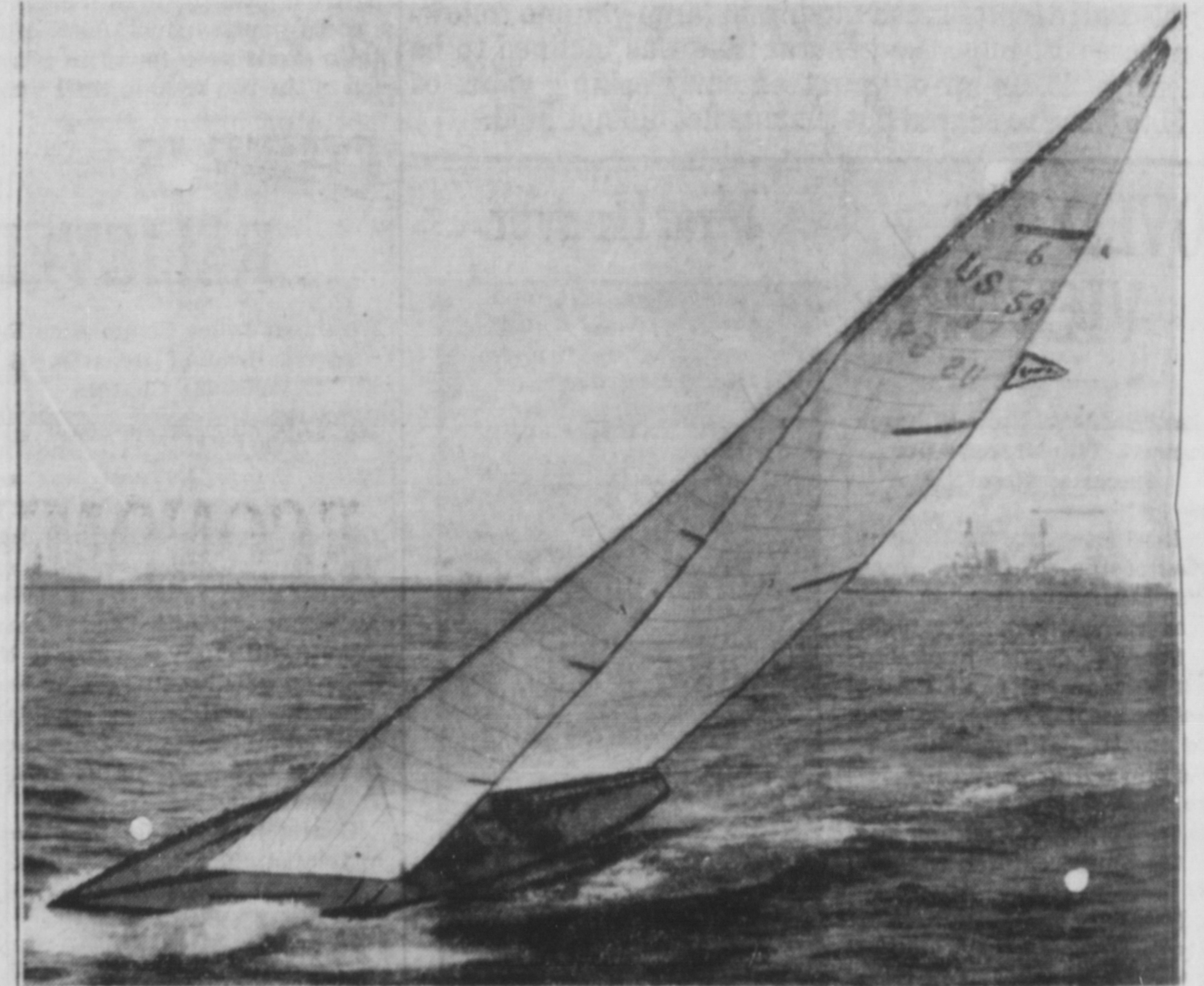
Rev. J. S. Perkins, a Manchester, Eng., Congregational minister, attended five Sunday boxing matches for the purpose of informing on the people conducting them contrary to the Sunday Observance Act. A jury at the Manchester Assizes awarded him \$7,500. Of this amount \$5,000 was against William Milward, manager of the Manchester Stadium, where the boxing contests were held, and \$2,500 against Councillor L. B. Cox, said to have been master of ceremonies. This was the full amount claimed by the minister. Judgment was entered by Justice Hawke. Mr. Perkins said that when he went to the boxing matches his collar was covered with a scarf. He told a reporter that he would not use a single penny of the amount awarded him for his personal interest but would give it to some philanthropic or religious institution.
