LIBERALS WILL CONVENE SOON

National Convention to be Held
in Ottawa Early in August;
Trade Policy.

A National Liberal Convention is to be held in Ottawa on August 5th, 6th and 7th. The convention has been called by the Liberal representatives in the House of Commons, under the leadership of D. D. McKenzie, M. P. for North Cape Breton. The purpose is threefold:

1. To make a declaration of Liberal principles as applied to present conditions throughout Canada.

2. To establish a nation-wide party organization.

3. To select a party leader in the place of the late Right Honorable Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

The convention will comprise three delegates from each federal election district throughout the Dominion elected at a district convention.

Calgary Platform

"The policy of the Liberal party of Canada with respect to reciprocity and lower tariff met defeat in 1911, was reasserted in the Winnipeg platform of 1917 and in the Calgary platform of 1919. As there is now a prospect of an early election in which the trade question will be the most prominent issue, it is a matter of supreme importance that all who believe in greater freedom of trade, wider markets and a reduction of the present 42½ per cent. tariff, should attend the primaries and district Liberal conventions and so assist in the selection of delegates to the National Convention at Ottawa and the nomination of candidates for the House of Commons.

Powerful Forces.

"Lack of unity of action among the producers and consumers of Western Canada would be fatal now. The powerful forces which have always been against us are alarmed and only by dividing us into factions and classes can they again attain power. The plan of their campaign is now becoming clear and encouragement is being given to the formation of new parties and multiplicity of candidates. This is their only hope of again defeating us. We cannot hope to have any large section of the press support our cause; and the powerful agencies of the Big Interests are everywhere. This condition has become intolerable. Only united action can emancipate us."
