Taking Strike Vote Today.

Today the union men of Prince Rupert are voting on the question of whether or not they shall give a committee power to call a strike if they think it wise. That is a good deal of power to hand over to a small committee. If the committee has the full confidence of everybody and their judgment can be relied on it may be all right, but the average man likes to do his own thinking, to form his own judgment, and on so important a matter as going out on strike he would prefer to be the arbiter. Just what view the union men will take of the matter will not be known until this evening.

Public Reception Has Been Suggested.

There seems to be a general feeling around town that a public reception should be given to Lieut.-Col. McMordie. It is not because he is an officer but because he was a well known and respected citizen before leaving and because he has conducted himself as a soldier and won honors overseas. He carried the name of the city to France and Flanders and did honor to her wherever he went.

Imports and Exports Of Prince Rupert.

A study of the imports and exports of this city for the past three years is very interesting. For 1918 the imports were valued at \$1,906,906 and the exports at \$4,242,740. In 1916 the imports were only \$1,205,322, while the exports were about the same. In 1917 the exports dropped off slightly.

In 1916 Prince Rupert was the third city in the province in imports and the second in exports. Last year she was fourth in imports, Nanaimo having ousted her from third place, and in exports she fell back to fifth place, New Westminster having jumped up to over eight million dollars.

While Prince Rupert has been practically standing still the other places have been going ahead. This year Prince Rupert has begun to move, but the strike setback is likely to have an important effect and it is possible the gain may not be as much as it might have been under better conditions.

Whaling is Important Industry.

Whale oil was formerly one of the chief oils used for illuminating purposes, but a good deal of its importance in this respect has been lost, owing to the competition of mineral oils. The increased demand in recent years for oils of all kinds for soap making and for use in the manufacture of margarine and other edible fats has led to a renewed demand for whale oil and a remarkable development in the whaling industry. Whaling has also been rendered more profitable than it was in former years through the employment of improved methods of dealing with the catch whereby practically the whole of the carcass is utilized.

In the North Atlantic and Arctic seas the principal localities where whaling is carried on are in the neighborhood of the Faroes, Iceland, the coast of Norway, and the Newfoundland coast. Whaling enterprises are conducted in the southern hemisphere off the coast of Chile, from Durban, Natal, from Portuguese East Africa, and from the Seychelles; some of these, however, have been interrupted or have temporarily ceased during the war. But it is in the British colony of the Falkland Islands and its dependencies of South Georgia, the South Shetlands, Graham Land, and the South Orkneys that the greatest developments have taken place. The whaling waters of these seas are the most lucrative ever exploited.

LAND REGISTRY ACT.

(Sections 36 and 134.) Re Application No. 10,607-1. File 6,100. TAKE NOTICE that application has been made to register Thomas McManamon, of Prince Rupert, B.
