EXPERT VISITS SALT LAKES

Swimming Instructress From Victoria Speaks of Value of Swimming Pool as Civic Asset.

Prince Rupert's Salt Lake swimming pool was inspected yesterday by Mr. and Mrs. R. W. Hiberson of Victoria. They expressed surprise that Prince Rupert should have so valuable an institution and spoke of the desirability of encouraging the young people to learn the art of swimming.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Hiberson are expert swimmers, the latter being the life saving instructress for the Victoria Amateur Swimming Club and one of the prominent members of the Victoria Ladies Swimming Club prior to its amalgamation with the other club.

Discussing the value of swimming to the community Mrs. Hiberson said that she considered it just as important that children should learn to swim as that they should learn to read and write.

Ideal for Purpose.
In speaking to president T. C. Duncan of the local club she said that the lake was ideal for the purpose. In a place like this it meant so much to have a place where young and old could enjoy the sport and learn such a useful art. She thought, however, that it would take a great deal of sand to make a good beach where the children could enjoy themselves.

The lady swimmer also said it was refreshing to hear of a city council that took sufficient interest in swimming to make a grant toward the work of improving the accommodation. She thought it should be a very great civic asset and a place of which the citizens might well be proud.

FARM LOANS for SOLDIERS



Cheap Implements, Livestock and Harness

THE Soldier Settlement Board has arranged with manufacturers of implements and harness to give soldier settlers a wide choice of first class implements at prices substantially below those quoted to civilians; and in the Prairie Provinces the United Grain Growers, Limited, will give soldier settlers special prices on implements, wagons, and other commodities.

By collective buying in large numbers for cash, it can also offer soldiers the lowest possible prices on horses and other live stock.

It can supply a good harness set for approximately \$31.50 at point of manufacture.

All these concessions are in addition to the Board's offer to secure for the soldiers good

land, conveniently located, and to give financial assistance in the way of loans to establish them on the land.

Land and Loans

With certain exceptions, a soldier who has served with good conduct in the Canadian, Imperial or Allied forces in an actual theatre of war or outside the country in which he enlisted (or widow of any such man) may secure loans to purchase land, live stock and equipment and erect buildings—

- (1) Up to \$4,500 to cover the cost of the land and discharge encumbrances.
- (2) Up to \$1,000 to erect buildings. Both these loans to be paid on the instalment plan. Payments extending over 25 years.

(3) Up to \$2,000 to buy implements, live stock, and equipment. The soldier will begin to pay off this loan in the third year, and will have four years to pay.

Only five per cent. will be charged on these loans.

A cash payment of one-tenth the price of the land will be required, except in special cases.

Qualified settlers on Dominion Lands may secure loans up to a maximum of \$3,000 on a plan similar to the above for farm equipment, live stock, and erection of buildings, provided security offered justifies the loan.

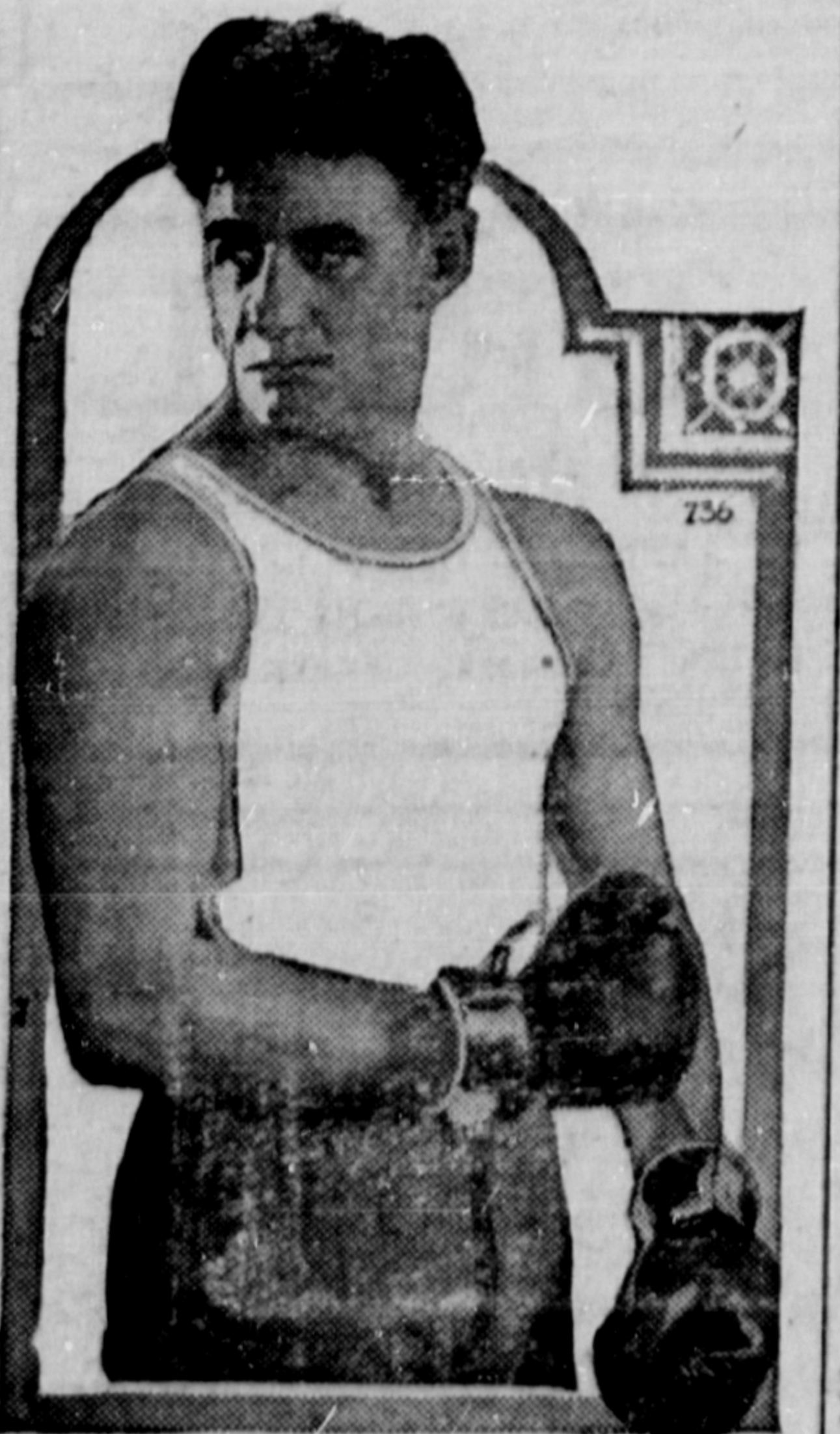

WATER ACT, 1914. RIPARIAN RIGHTS

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim. Such statements of claim shall be filed in duplicate with the Water Recorder of the Water District in which the water is diverted or used.
After the first day of June, 1920, no right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose shall exist by virtue only of any ownership of land. Forms of statement of claim can be obtained from the Water Recorders of the several Water Districts in the Province or from the Comptroller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C.
