

#### Prince Rupert's Exports To the United States.

In the supplement to the commerce reports of the United States dealing with the American consulate of Prince Rupert are to be found some very interesting figures. According to that report the exports from this district to the United States for 1917 were valued at \$4,160,324, while for last year they fell to \$2,-822,765. The reason for the falling off is not given, but it is assumed that it was caused very largely by the signing of the armistice. Blister copper exports dropped from \$1,259,852 to \$261,620.

The largest value is in the halibut which in 1917 was valued at over two millions, whereas last year it fell to slightly over a million and a half. There were large increases in the value of want.
