latitude fifty-five degrees forty-two minutes twenty-one seconds north, longitude one hundred and thirty-four degrees twelve minutes thirty seconds west; thence southeast (magnetic) nineteen miles to a point approximately latitude fifty-five degrees twenty-four minutes north, longitude one hundred and thirty-four degrees three minutes forty-two seconds west; thence northeast eight and six-tenths miles, touching the north shore of the outer and bisecting the inner of the two islets southwest of Cape Addington, Noyes Island, to a point on Noyes Island.

From the northwest extremity of Cape Lynch, Hecata Island, southeast three-fourths south approximately fourteen and five-tenths miles, to a point on Noyes Island in range with the peak shown on chart numbered eighty-one hundred and fifty published by the Coast and Geodetic Survey, said point being approximately in west longitude one hundred and thirty-three degrees thirty-nine minutes thirty seconds.

"That any person or persons, firms, association, or corporation, or its officers, violating any provision of this act or any regulation established or to be established in pursuance thereof shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or imprisonment at hard labor for a term of not more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court; and every vessel, its catch, its apparatus, or equipment used or employed in violation of any provisions of this act or any regulation made thereunder may be seized by order of the Secretary of Commerce and shall be held subject to the fine or fines that may be imposed.

"That the violation of any provision of this act may be prosecuted in any district court of Alaska or any district court of the United States of Washington, Oregon, or California. And it shall be the duty of the Secretary of Commerce to enforce the provisions of this act and the rules and regulations made and to be made thereunder, and such officers and employees as he may employ or designate for this purpose shall have authority to enter on and search any vessel suspected of violation of this act. And it shall be the duty of the district attorney to whom any violation is reported by any agent or representative of the Department of Commerce to institute proceedings necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.

"That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are, so far as inconsistent, hereby repealed.

"That this act shall take effect as soon as possible after the enactment of concurrent or essentially similar regulations by the Government of the Dominion of Canada, either by act of Parliament, order in council, or other proper means; and the Secretary of Commerce is authorized and directed to take steps as may be necessary to inform himself of the enactment of such regulations and when in his opinion such regulations have been made, he shall set a date on which this act shall become effective, after not less than two months' nor more than four months' notice. And if the Dominion of Canada shall pass regulations similar to or concurrent with one or more of the provisions of this act but not with all, the Secretary of Commerce is authorized and directed to give effect to the provisions so concurring in but not to the others.

"That if at any time the regulations of the Dominion of Canada should, in the opinion of the Secretary of Commerce after due investigation, be inadequate in their provisions or enforcement, the Secretary is authorized and directed to suspend the operation of this act until such time as he may be satisfied that such provisions and their enforcement have been made adequate for the protection of the halibut fisheries.

"That nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit or prevent any person or persons from fishing for or catching halibut for domestic consumption and not for sale."

UNITED STATES WILL PROTECT HALIBUT BANKS

Draft of Bill Introduced into Congress Nearly Two Weeks Ago But not Yet Law.

Congressman Alexander introduced into the House of Representatives the following bill dealing with the halibut industry:

"Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that it shall be unlawful to fish for or catch halibut during the months of December and January in each year in any and all waters of the Pacific ocean, its bays, sounds, or tributaries over which the United States exercises jurisdiction, or to land, deliver, or offer for sale at any port or place in the United States any halibut taken in such waters or in any other part of the Pacific ocean during the said months, or for any vessel or boat of the United States or person belonging to or on such vessel or boat, or person owing obedience to the laws of the United States, to fish for or catch halibut in any part of the Pacific ocean during the said months of December and January of each year.

"That it shall be unlawful for any vessel or boat of the United States or person belonging to or on such vessel or boat, or any person owing obedience to the laws of the United States, to fish for or catch halibut at any time within the area circumscribed by lines as follows, or for any vessel, boat, person, or corporation to land at any port or place in the United States any halibut taken within such area, which area is hereby recognized and designated as a nursery for halibut:

"From the northwest extremity of Cape Lynch, Hecata Island, southwest (magnetic) eighteen miles to a point approximately
