**RETURNED MEN  
RAILROADING**

Percentage of Profits for All Men  
Who Stay With Job Until  
Completed—Will Pay  
Minimum Wage.

McArthur, Stewart & Williams, a new contracting firm recently organized in Vancouver, have taken a contract from W. P. Tierney & Co. for a mile and a half of work on the Copper Mountain Railway near Princeton. The principals of the firm are returned soldiers, Capt. Rex McArthur, formerly superintendent of construction on the Hudson's Bay road, having seen service in France with the Canadian Railway Corps, while Lieut. Stewart was in the trenches with the 8th (Winnipeg) Battalion.

The new firm, which has already men on the ground, proposes to start operations at once and is anxious to employ none but returned veterans. Between 100 and 150 men will be required and already a number have been engaged. Capt. McArthur is authority for the statement that the wages paid will be the minimum set by the Dominion fair wage officer, and, in addition, a percentage of the profits will be paid to all who remain on the work till completion.

The firm will sell from its store to the employees at a profit of 10 per cent, and the net returns from this operation will be returned to the employees in the shape of a recreation tent, where magazines, gramophone and other amusements will be provided.

The aim of the firm is to conduct the work as closely as possible to a co-operative basis. The offices of the company are in the Credit Foncier Building.

**OUTBREAK OF FIRE IN  
FAMILY SHOE STORE**

Half an Hour After Store Closed  
On Saturday Night, Fire  
Was Discovered.

About quarter to eleven on Saturday night an alarm of fire was rung into headquarters from the down town section, where smoke was seen issuing from the premises of the Family Shoe Store. The department was quickly on the job and managed to confine the outbreak to the store.

The blaze had apparently originated at the back of the front store, and had a good hold when the firemen arrived. The flames were prevented from breaking through to the dwelling houses above, however, and were quickly subdued. The origin of the fire is a mystery, as the store was closed for the night only half an hour before the fire was discovered, and at that time everything was in good shape.

Considerable damage was done to the shoe stock, chiefly by smoke and water, although the leather goods burnt will also amount to a fair sum. The full extent of the damage is not yet estimated, and it is understood it is covered by insurance.
