

Dumping the large amount of meat owned by the War Department on the market would not only mean a big loss to the army but it would be disastrous for many business interests, Hare

"It would undoubtedly drive the small grocers out of business,"

he said. "The amount of meat held by the government is now about 1141,000,000 pounds, valued at \$60,000,000.

"All our efforts to dispose of the meat in this country brought bids offering about 50 per cent. of the cost to the government, and we have been of the opinion that this is too large a sacrifice," Hare said.

Foreign demand, however, has already bid for about 70 per cent. of the total supply at prices slightly under the government cost. Roumania is willing to take nearly the entire supply and offers treasury notes in uayment.
