# RESIGN, ALLOWING HIM FREE HAND (Special to The News via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)

Vancouver, June 26 .- According to the Vancouver Province yesterday, the Minister of Marine, the Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, has written to the Vancouver Harbor Commissioners asking for their resignations. This is in connection with the new harbor improvement scheme proposed for Vancouver. As the project is expected to cost in the neighborhood of \$5,000,000, the minister would like to have a free hand in the matter of its expenditure.

It is believed that the new board will include at least one returned soldier.

The proposed harbor improvement scheme will include the construction of terminal railway facilities, also more commodious docks and sheds, together with an improved equipment for the handling of cargoes both in and out of the port of Vancouver, and at the same time better fire protection for the waterfront.
