Vancouver, June 26 .- Those who were inclined to be sceptical of the success of the activities of the Provincial Land Settlement Board as far as British Columbia was concerned, and there were many, will find food for reflection in the remarkable figures showing what has been accomplished

shows that no fewer than 2,818 men have appeared before the qualification board and have been passed efficient as farmers. Loans have been made in 511 cases, while there are 196 cases still pending, and 129 applications disallowed. The total amount provided for the purchase of land alone amounts to \$1,241,194.45, while loans approved for purposes other than the actual purchase of land reach the total of \$729,796.
