WESTHOLME ORCHESTRA RETURNING FROM TOUR

Have Spent Several Weeks in the Omineca and Nechaco Countries Giving Concerts At Many Places.

The Westholme Orchestra which has been touring the upper country for the last few weeks, gave their farewell concert at Prince George last Saturday. They have been greatly appreciated at every point and in commenting upon their last concert the Prince George "Citizen" says:
"The farewell concert of the Westholme Orchestra of Prince Rupert brought to a close the most notable week of music in the history of Prince George. The orchestra consists of four highly gifted musicians, whose ensemble playing is all that could be desired, while their dance music was a delight to everyone. The compelling rhythm of their playing took every last trace of effort out of dancing and left only the pleasure and poetry of motion.
"The leading number of the first concert, the William Tell overture, was rendered with a precision and finish worthy of a symphony orchestra. Mr. Will Edmunds, cellist, rendered Massenet's "Elegy" with depth of feeling and finished artistry, and his encore "Mother Machree" was played in a style that showed the wonderful possibilities of his instrument.
"Mr. William Balagno, violinist, is a young artist who most decidedly has a future. He played "Souvenir" by Drlia with dash and distinction.
"A grand concert solo, "Luisa di Montfort," was the vehicle by which Mr. Harry Reid showed himself a master of his instrument, the clarinet.
"The pianist, Mr. Chas. Balagno, proved to be at all times a reliable and efficient accompanist and supported his part of the various numbers in a highly creditable and artistic manner.
"The main number of the Saturday concert was a selection of airs from "Carmen" in which the orchestra sustained and even advanced the standard they had set during the week here.
"It is to be hoped that at some future time the orchestra will make a return visit to Prince George, and they may be assured of a hearty welcome, for they have made many friends both by their superb playing and their pleasing personalities. A vote of thanks is due Mr. W. J. Pitman, who brought the orchestra here and gave us all (for we are all music lovers) such a splendid feast of music."

RAIN BADLY NEEDED IN SASKATCHEWAN AREAS

Regina, June 27.—With a total of 14,747,000 acres under seed to wheat, oats, rye and barley in Saskatchewan, a decrease of 312,000 acres is shown in the preliminary estimates issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics as compared with 1918, and received yesterday by the provincial department of agriculture. The estimate shows a decrease of 370,000 acres to 879,000 acres in wheat; increase of 100,000 to 508,000 acres in oats, and an increase of 14,000 to 137,000 acres in rye.
