Big German Effort To Hold Back Allies.

Undoubtedly the Germans are now bent on defending their * lines and preventing the Allies getting within striking distace of their own cities and towns. Also they are setting up another peace drive in order to try to save some of the fruits of their early victories before it is 'too late.

The defences are undoubtedly strong and for that reason the Allies have been pausing before making another big drive Arm. forward. The pause is not likely to last long for reinforcements are steadily being poured across the Atlantic and absolutely fresh troops are taking part in the campaign.

The peace drive is a danger to the Germans. If the German people once get the idea firmly in their minds that peace is the right thing they will possibly refuse to fight and then the military caste of Germany will be doomed. Already there is much unrest. It may be that to guide that unrest into what is considered safe channels is the policy which is being adopted.

Prince Rupert is Preparing for Peace.

Baron Shaughnessy says that it is time to prepare for peace times. A good many people have been saying that for a long time but when the Baron says it he says it with more force than most people.
