SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed Records will be granted covering only

suitable for agricultural purposes which is non-timber land. Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims. Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements value of \$10 per acre, including clearing

and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant. Where | =-emptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because

of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent residence

may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 may be leased as homesites; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions For grazing and industrial purposes

areas exceeding 640 acres may be lease by one person or company.
