**Wives and Families  
Still Much Underpaid.**

The question of providing for the wives and families of soldiers overseas so that they may be in a position to live respectably and without having to deny themselves all the pleasures which ordinary people enjoy, is still being discussed in many quarters. There is a strong feeling in many quarters that the Patriotic Fund should be provided and administered by the Government and that the allowance from that source should be increased. There is also an agitation going on in the larger cities asking that the separation allowance be increased.

It matters little how the increase is made as long as the women and children get the money. Just now many of them find it almost impossible to live on the miserable pittance that is allowed them, and the results have in many cases been that women have been led to accept presents from men and thus lose their self respect.

**No Argument  
Is Necessary.**

It seems so foolish to try to argue on a question of this kind because on the face of it the need of increasing the allowance is so self evident. It was expected that the present Dominion Government would have moved in this matter long before now. They have been putting it off much too long and very soon they will find that their action will be very strongly resented.

There is nothing smacking of partyism about this movement. Liberals and Conservatives are agreed that there should be something done immediately. It is a matter which concerns the honor of the nation and should be attended to at once.

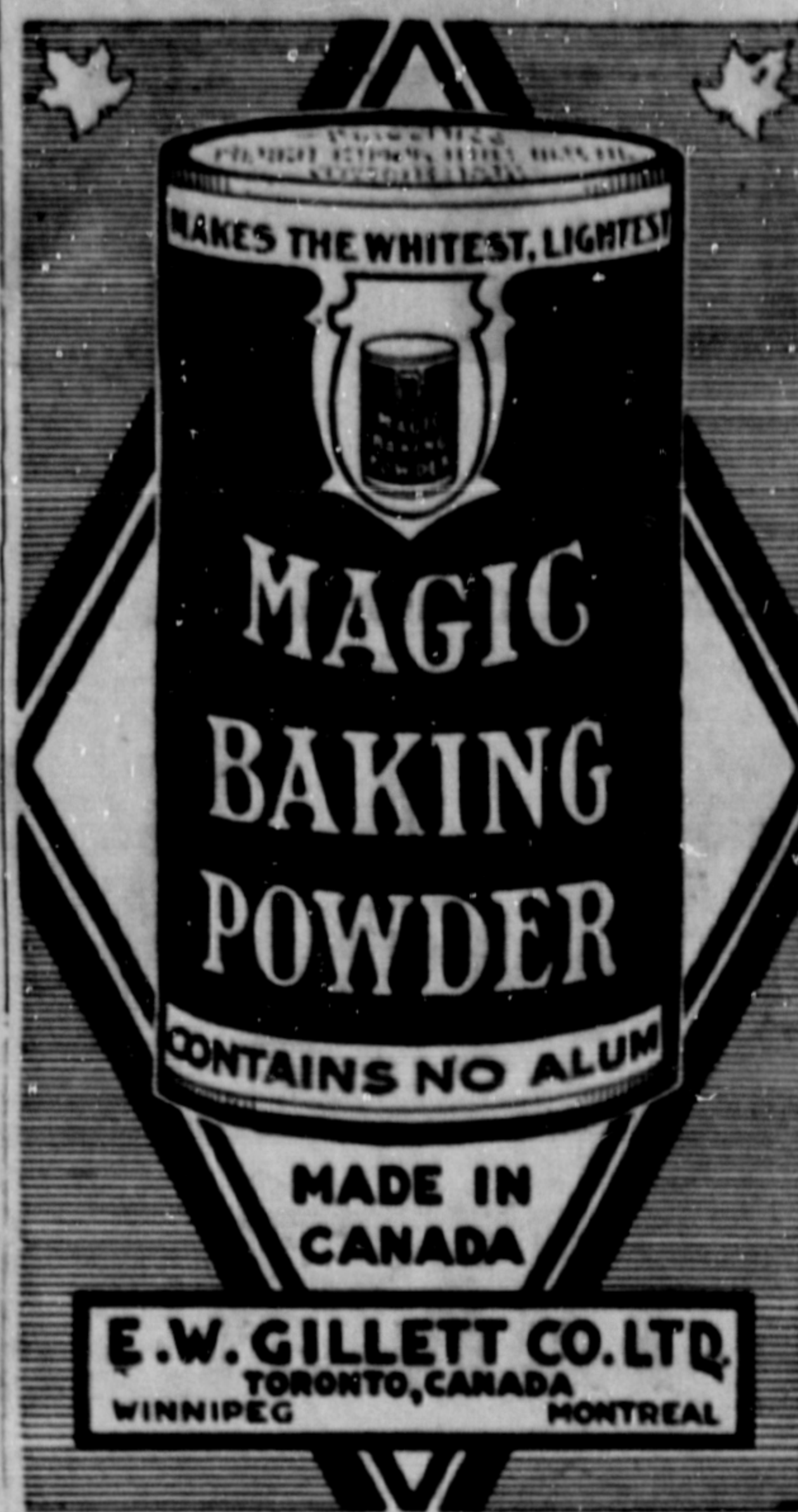
**Picture Advertising

**Ministers Are  
Coming Tomorrow.**

Preparations are being made to give them a fitting reception and it is hoped that all the people will unite in making them welcome and in showing them something of our resources and our needs. They hold two of the most important positions in the Government and to them Prince Rupert must look for any Government aid that may be needed here.

**LAND REGISTRY ACT.**  
(Sections 36 and 134.)

Re Application No. 9768-1 & 9771-1.  
TAKE NOTICE that application has been made to register Nathan Louis Lando and Dora Scheinman as owners in fee under two Tax Sale Deeds from the Collector of the City of Prince Rupert, bearing date the 24th day of November, 1917, of ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Municipality of the City of Prince Rupert, more particularly known and described as Lot eleven (11), Block twenty-five (25), Section seven (7), and Lot thirteen (13) Block thirty-five (35), Section eight (8), Map 923. You are required to contest the claim of the tax purchaser within 35 days from the date of the service of this notice (which may be effected by publication in the Daily News, and your attention is called to section 36 of the "Land Registry Act" with amendments, and to the following extract therefrom:—

"and in default of a caveat or certificate of its pendency being filed before the registration as owner of the person entitled under such tax sale, all persons so served with notice, and those claiming through or under them, and all persons claiming any interest in the land by virtue of any unregistered instrument, and all persons claiming any interest in the land by descent whose title is not registered under the provisions of this Act, shall be forever estopped and debarred from setting up any claim to or in respect of the land so sold for taxes, and the Registrar shall register the person entitled under such tax sale as owner of the land so sold for taxes."

AND WHEREAS application has been made for a Certificate of Indefeasible Title to the above-mentioned lands, in the name of Nathan Louis Lando and Dora Scheinman.

AND WHEREAS on investigating the title it appears that prior to the 12th day of October, 1916 (the date on which the said lands were sold for overdue taxes), you were the registered owner thereof.

FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that it is the time I shall effect registration in pursuance of such application and issue a Certificate of Indefeasible Title to the said lands in the names of Nathan Louis Lando and Dora Scheinman unless you take and prosecute the proper proceedings to establish your claim, if any, to the said lands, or to prevent such proposed action on my part.
