**Y. M. C. A. Campaign Commences Next Week.**

A big campaign to raise over a million dollars for the Y. M. C. A. will commence early next week. This is for the work of the Association throughout Canada, particularly in connection with the reconstruction work following the war.

It is quite unnecessary to tell of the work done by the Y. M. C. A. during the war and especially on the battlefields where the indefatigable secretaries have followed the line of trenches with their aids to the soldiers.

The men are now returning and the need of the Y. M. C. A. work at home is almost as great as it was overseas. In all the large cities there are branches and it is understood that one will be opened in Prince Rupert before long.

The present campaign, however, is not for the Prince Rupert "Y" but for the general fund throughout the Dominion. That there will be a good response from the people here goes without saying, if only it were done for the sake of showing appreciation for past services to our boys when overseas.

**Japan in Limelight At Peace Conference.**

It looks as if Japan was trying to get a stranglehold on China in return for her services to the Allies in the recent war. She already controls Korea and now she has designs on the bigger nation. Japan probably deserves some reward, although she did not do much of the fighting.

China is helpless because she is not a military country. To the victors the spoils is still the morality of the world. Japan does not see why she has not a right there just as much as Germany and Great Britain.

President Wilson is taking a different view of the matter. He sees it from the ideal and correct viewpoint, but whether he can carry the nations with him remains to be seen.

**SHIPBUILDING FIRM TALKS OF COMING HERE**

Armstrong, Whitworth & Co. Considering Possibility of Opening Branch in This City.

H. McCall, general superintendent of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway here, while in Winnipeg a short while ago, had an interview with J. T. Kelly of the Armstrong, Whitworth & Co. armament and shipbuilding works, who was favorably impressed with Prince Rupert, and talked of opening up here in the near future.

This firm turned out during the war at their armament and shipbuilding works more than 13,000 guns, 12,000 gun mountings, 14½ million shells, 18 million fuses, 21 million cartridge cases, 1,075 aeroplanes, three airships, 47 warships, and 22 merchant ships, and fitted with armaments 583 war vessels.

**WATER ACT, 1914. RIPARIAN RIGHTS**

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required to or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim. Such statements of claim shall be filed in duplicate with the Water Recorder of the Water District in which the water is diverted or used.

After the first day of June, 1920, no right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose shall exist by virtue only of any ownership of land. Forms of statement of claim can be obtained from the Water Recorders of the several Water Districts in the Province or from the Comptroller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C.
