483 Miles Nearer.

"The port of Prince Rupert is bert when Col. Peck was wounded. 483 miles nearer Yokohama than he would long remember. when sailing from any other Pacific port. This means a very real shortening in the avenue of commerce between the East and the West, and Canada cannot afford to fail to take advantage of this factor. The proposal is that eight to ten steel vessels of the type now being constructed in various yards by the Dominion Government, be placed in opera-the Oriental ports. That a substantial trade awaits them there cannot be any doubt, and on their being placed in service there would come a natural increase in the traffic of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, in which the Dominion Government has from the inception been most vitally interested. A combination of private initiative and reasonable governmental assistance would undoubtedly insure good returns in this direction.

Insurance Rates.

"While in London I had an opportunity," continued Col. Peck, "of discussing with the officers of Lloyd's the question of insurance rates between Prince Rupert and Oriental ports as compared with other Pacific coast ports and no difficulties that I know of are to be anticipated in that direc-
