MUCH WORK DONE BY THE GOVERNMENT

going they must extend their markets and make an effort to take care of the foreign market. The order which had been secured for seventy million feet to go to the Old Country was more than the total annual output previously for export purposes. He thought that they would now be able to handle the export timber business as the Government had insisted that the lumbermen organize to promote the industry.

Pulp.
Speaking of pulp the minister said there should be a number of mills in this neighborhood. There was room for one or two on the Skeena River, and at Buckley Bay the timber might well be converted into pulp as there was 6,300 horse power going to waste in the river. There was also the power at Falls River and at Mill Bay and other points.

Mr. Pattullo went on to tell of the improved grazing policy inaugurated by his department, of the development of mining through the application of the measures passed recently, of the oil prospecting which they were about to commence and which if successful would pay off all the debt of the province, of the appropriation for research work and the establishment of industries, of the efforts to have an excursion of businessmen visit this district from Vancouver and Victoria, of the need of more people to help develop the country so that the burden of taxation might not be so heavy.

"We must face the situation with courage and optimism, but fortify ourselves with prudence and foresight," concluded the minister.

FISH ARRIVALS NOT SELLING HERE TODAY

One Salmon Boat Proceeded to Vancouver—Stranger Arrives for First Time.

Six fishing boats are in port this morning from the fishing grounds with the following catches:

The Stranger, 5,000; Eau Claire 800 lbs.; Pioneer, 65,000 lbs.; and Helgeland, 65,000, completed the halibut arrivals. It is understood that the fish will not sell today.

The Half Moon came in today with 1,000 lbs. of red salmon and 300 lbs. of whites. She will not sell here, but take them to Vancouver.

The Equator sold a catch of 2,500 lbs. of halibut to the Royal Fish Co. yesterday at 9c. per lb. straight.

Peck, transferred to the Canadian Scottish. He took part in many engagements with that battalion and after the armistice was signed marched through Belgium into Germany to beyond Cologne.
