Winnipeg, May 21.—Strike leaders are showing a willingness 10 talk settlement. Citizens are recruiting a vigilance force which is being enrolled to serve in case of trouble and the G. W. V. A. has summoned its president from Ottawa.

The railway passenger service is being maintained and the Federal ministers are expected to arrive Thursday, but it is understood they have no definite pian or powers.
