JUNEAU MINE NOW CLOSED

American Gastineau Company Ceases Mining Permanently.

JUNEAU, June 6.—The mine and mill of the Alaska-Gastineau Mining Company ceased operations permanently last Thursday. Dismantling of the plants has already commenced.

In making a statement, Mr. Geo. T. Jackson, general manager, said:

"Owing to the heavy rainfall of last Sunday, coupled with the warm weather of the past two days, so much water has come from the hills to the Perseverance mine we have been unable to handle it with our pumps, so the mine and mill will be closed."

"We had previously announced that we would operate through June," he continued, "but with this question of water confronting us we received orders to close down at once."

"The paper mills will be built there, for sure," he concluded, "but the actual date of the starting of the construction has not as yet been determined."

With the closing of this property a number of men will be thrown out of employment but it is thought that many will be retained for dismantling work.

CUBAN CHILD MAY HAVE BEEN VICTIM OF WITCH DOCTORS

HAVANA, Cuba, June 7.—Provincial authorities are conducting a searching investigation into the mysterious disappearance of a child from his home on a ranch near Guantanamo of Condido Martinez, aged 5 who it is reported, may have been a victim of witch doctors.

Three men and a woman are being held without bail for examination, one of them being known locally as a "healer" and seller of patent medicines. The aunt of the missing lad, his sole relative, says that his sister disappeared a year ago under similar circumstances.

DECIDE ON PRICES FOR SALMON HERE

Meeting Canners in Vancouver Last Friday Announces Prices.

VANCOUVER, June 7.—A meeting of the salmon canners operating in northern British Columbia, known as District No. 2, decided Friday that the prices to be paid the fishermen during the coming season, for sockeye salmon, shall be:

On the Skeena and Naas rivers, 30 cents per fish, if caught with private or independent gear, and 30 cents per fish if caught with cannery gear. On Rivers Inlet, Smiths Inlet and Fitzhugh Sound, 35 cents per fish, caught with leased gear.

TERRACE

This road will run along the east side of the lake a distance of about four miles and will enable passengers and freight to reach the hotel by land without it being necessary to take the launch, which has been the only means of reaching there in the past.
