PLAN TO GIVE RAILWAY BACK

Ottawa Says Silly Rumor and No Intention Abandon Government Ownership yet

OTTAWA, Jan. 17.—An extraordinary story has been sent out from Ottawa by the Canadian Press to the effect that government operated railways may be handed back to their original owners and that the arbitration to be held, a few weeks hence is for the purpose of determining the price.
