In 1914 the number of divorces in the United Kingdom was 1348, while for 1919, the latest figures available, it had jumped to 5763. In nearly half the cases the divorce was to a large extent the result of a childless marriage.

In these days when there is matrimonial infidelity people look to divorce as a cure, whereas in the old days they made the best of a bad job and carried on, husband and wife living a cat and dog life. It is doubtful if the divorce court record is a sign of moral decadence. It is a sign of a different attitude toward life, whether for better or for worse only time will tell.

CANCELLATION OF RESERVE,

Notice is hereby given that the reserve against the acquisition of coal under the Coal and Petroleum Act, established by notice dated the 1st day of April, 1920, and published in the *British Columbia Gazette* on the 12th of February, 1920, is cancelled, except so far as the same relates to the following areas:

1. All the land lying within the boundaries of the drainage areas of the Skeena River above and including Out Creek, the East Fork of the Nass River, the Little Klap-pan River, and the upper reaches of the Nass River, above, and including Klappan and Inlet.

All that portion of Vancouver Island lying easterly of the following described boundaries:

Commencing at a point on the West Coast of the Island at the mouth of Muir Creek, the line running easterly following the western boundary of the Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway Belt to the southeastern corner of the said reserve; thence northerly following the western boundary of the Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway Belt to the northwesterly corner of the said reserve; thence easterly following the western boundary of the Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway Belt to the northwesterly corner of the watershed of the Nimpkish River, thence northwesterly along the westerly boundary of the watershed of the Nimpkish River to the mouth of the Nimpkish River, thence along Spruce Creek to the east boundary of Township 3, Imperial District, thence west along the south boundary of Township 3, 43 and 44 to the Pacific Ocean, and including all the territories and islands lying between the East Coast of Vancouver Island, together with all Islands lying between the mainland of the Province south of the 52nd parallel of north latitude and Vancouver Island and the Districts of Gidley, Goldstream, Metlakatla, Esquimalt, Victoria, Lake and North and South Saanich, Sooke and Highland.

The cancellation of this reserve shall not take effect until notice of such cancellation is published for sixty (60) days in the *British Columbia Gazette* and a copy of such notice is filed in each of the Land Registration Districts of the Province of B. C.

This notice shall in no wise affect the rights against the acquisition of coal and petroleum in the Peace River District established by notice in the *British Columbia Gazette* on the 27th of March, 1919, which reserve is still in force and effect.
