PROSPECTORS SEARCH FOR ELDORADO, BUT FAIL TO LOCATE IT

ST. JOHN, N. B. July 27.—From Victoria County comes the story of gold-hunters swarming over the country drained by the Wapash River and panning the sands of the stream in search of the yellow metal. Prospectors are there from all parts of Canada and the United States; the most experienced miners of the continent are seeking to find gold that has been vainly sought for many years.

enough nuggets out of the rock to make a ring for himself. The story spread through the district like wildfire, but Giberson refused to tell where he had picked up the rock. Later he became insane and died without revealing the golden secret.

Since that time many expeditions have been formed to search for the vein, but no one has been able to locate it. This season a systematic search is being conducted and borings and panning are being made extensively. The searchers claim to have made discoveries that indicate the presence in the district of large quantities of gold, but so far the location of the Giberson lode remains a mystery.

THINK GOVERNMENT OF MEIGHEN DOOMED

Member for Three Rivers, Quebec Says Alberta Election Points Way.

WINNIPEG, July 27.—A federal election this fall is practically a certainty, and the signs of the times point to the defeat of the Meighen government, according to Jacques Bureau, member for Three Rivers, Quebec, a guest at the Royal Alexandra hotel. Mr. Bureau, accompanied by his wife has been visiting relatives at Paradise Hill, Saskatchewan, and before leaving for the east will visit French settlements to the south of Winnipeg.

"The overthrow of the Stewart government in Alberta is a plain indication of what will happen to the present administration at Ottawa," said Mr. Bureau. "The people in Alberta had nothing against Premier Stewart. But they decided it was time for a change. Hon. Frank Oliver told me two weeks ago, when I was in Edmonton, that Stewart's government would be defeated."

He declared that the Meighen government should have gone to the country some time ago, and with the result of the Medicine Hat by-election, and the sweeping victories of the farmers in Alberta, he did not see how the evil day could be postponed any longer. When it was pointed out that Premier Meighen might have to stay in London until August 4 as a result of recent developments at the conference of Premiers, he shrugged his shoulders and replied that the political machine would have to prepare for the election.

Prohibition in Quebec.

When asked concerning the probability of Quebec entering the list of provinces who have determined in favor of prohibition, he declared the disposition of the French people would not permit this state of affairs to come to pass. Provincial laws concerning voting on prohibition are so different there that a municipality or a county might vote in favor of prohibition and in two years be permitted to again express an opinion.

Crops are looking fine in northern Saskatchewan, he said, the district in which his relatives live expecting to get 40 to 45 bushels an acre from their wheat lands.

EGGS SELL HIGHER EDMONTON MARKET

Retail Now at From 40 to 45 Cents a Dozen. Dairy Butter 35c to 40c.

EDMONTON, July 27.—Eggs are selling at from 40c to 45c per dozen on the Rice Street Market, an increase of 5 c per dozen over the previous week. The price of eggs has been on the gradual incline for the past month and although it has increased from 25c to 45c, the demand is quite equal to the supply and some of the dealers are of the opinion that the price is not likely to go down for some time. Dairy butter has also increased in price and was selling at from 35c to 40c per pound depending upon the quality. This is an increase of 5c per pound over last week.

Roots were offered in large quantities and as usual at this season of the year are on the gradual decline. Beets, carrots, radishes, turnips and on-bags were selling at 5c per bunch. Some of the dealers in order to clean up were selling radishes at three bunches for 10c. New potatoes were offered by a dozen or more dealers and at prices ranging from five to six pence for 25c were in fairly good demand. Old potatoes, were offered by four or five dealers and in small quantities were in very good demand, selling for as high as 75c per bushel.
