The Jasper baseballers will arrive on tomorrow night's train from the interior. There will be fourteen officials and players in the party according to a wire which reached the city yesterday requesting that accommodation be reserved. The first game will be played on Friday evening and there will be a doubleheader on Saturday. On Sunday evening the players will go to Anyox on the Cheloh-shi to play a series there and will return to Prince Rupert next Thursday evening playing another match here on Friday before returning to the interior.

For the series, the local baseball association is selling season tickets costing \$1 each. The price of admission to single games will be 50c. Already there is a good sale of tickets and much interest being manifested in the outcome of the games. The locals are not very much afraid of being beaten but are looking for good contests as are all the fans. From these games much will be judged as to the standard of ball being played in the interior this season.

The doubleheader between Vanderhoof and the Jasperites on Friday and Saturday resulted in one victory apiece. In the first game, played in the rain, the visitors were successful by a score of 7 to 3 while in the Saturday game, when the weather cleared up and conditions were ideal, the Vanderhoof boys won by a score of 8 to 4. The first game was a rather loose affair owing to the disagreeable conditions under which it was played but in the second the play was airtight and every point was keenly contested.

CALLIES BEAT SONS ENGLAND

Victors by 2 to 0 in Rather Ineffective Exhibition Soccer Last Night.

The return Senior Football League fixture between the Sons of Canada and the Callies was played last night before a large crowd and the Scotsmen took the Sassenachs into camp by a score of two to nil. The game could not be termed a good game of football but what was lacking in science certainly was made up for in energy although, at times, both sides showed glimpses of good combined work. With the incline in their favor, the Callies were the most dangerous in the early part of the game and McCreish spoiled an excellent chance of scoring in the early stages. Percy Tinker had the best scoring chance when he burst through on his own but the ball was finally put past. Lambe and Harry Fanthorpe also made creditable attempts at scoring. In this period old ankle trouble necessitated the retirement of McCreish, the Callies' centre. With thirty-five minutes gone, success came to the Callies, Kinghorn scoring with a long shot which found the English defense in an uncertain mood. Shortly afterwards the Callies were awarded a penalty kick and Kinghorn again made no mistake.

Second Half.

The Sons started off the second half in a promising manner but numerous good chances were wasted, although it must be said the Callies' defence was giving nothing away except for a few fruitless corners. Ineffective work in the front line has been the trouble with the Sons of England all season and last night proved no exception. A little less speed and more headwork might be productive of better results. Farquhar had two good individual efforts while Tinker headed narrowly over the bar when close in. The Callies were still having their share of the play and Winsky had to look lively on numerous occasions to clear his lines. Marks almost finding the net once with a quick return. Towards the finish the Sons had three or four corners all well placed but were unable to score. There was no scoring in the second half, the game standing at the end the same as at the half time, two to nothing in favor of the Scots.

For the Callies all the defence played well but especial mention was due Campbell at left half. The forward line was more effective than usual, mainly due to the robust tactics of Stewart. Butters, on his first senior appearance, did exceptionally well.
