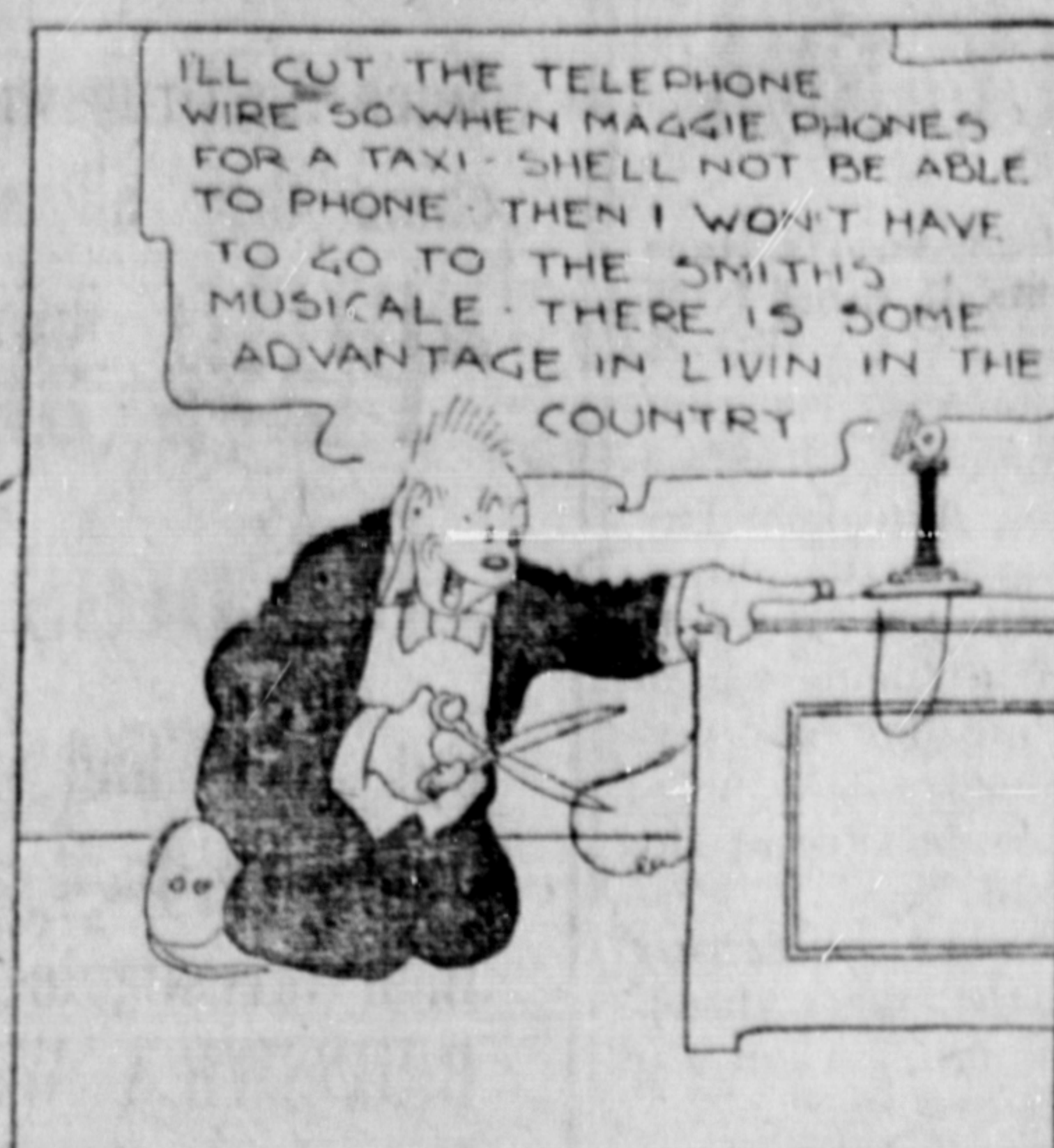

DOLLAR A SALMON PRICE IN EDMONTON

Fish Taken Direct from Coast and Sold on Prairies

"One dollar a salmon" was the slogan of the Vancouver Island Fish Co., which opened a two-day sale of choice sea food direct from the fisherman to the consumer, or, in the words of the company, "from the fishing boats to you." The low price of a dollar a fish for one of the flinty fish that looked as big as a suit of clothes tucked under the arm, was the magnet that first drew the crowd and soon made them a common carrier of what looked like a week's family rations.

The experiment is new in Edmonton, but if successful the Vancouver Island Fish Company, limited, producers of sea foods, intend to bring to this city, starting with next fall, a carload or two of salmon pinks and other fish at least every two weeks for direct distribution to the Edmonton public.
