# NEW STOCK FOR FARMS

Number of Heifers Imported For Central B. C. Through Railway Co-operation

The first shipment of heifers, under the Free Freight Policy, for the season was distributed along the Canadian National line from Mc-Bride to Prince George on August 15 and 16 as follows: S. Birkenhead; (1), I. Martinsen (2), William Brownlee (1), all of McBride. At Hutton, W. H. Chance (1), C. H. Weaver (2); Mrs. Ida Neilans at Giscome purchased 12 and Mrs. F. M. Harvie at the same point, two. Chris Mans at Willow River secured three head and Walter B. Turner, Prince George, five head.

These heifers are of Shorthorn and Red Polled breeding, of exceptionally good quality and in good condition. The price was from \$3.00 to \$5.00 per head less than prevailing prices on former shipments. All purchasers expressed themselves as highly pleased with the stock selected for them. It is anticipated that this shipment is but a forerunner of several more which will be brought into the district in the near future. Orders are already being placed for future shipments.




