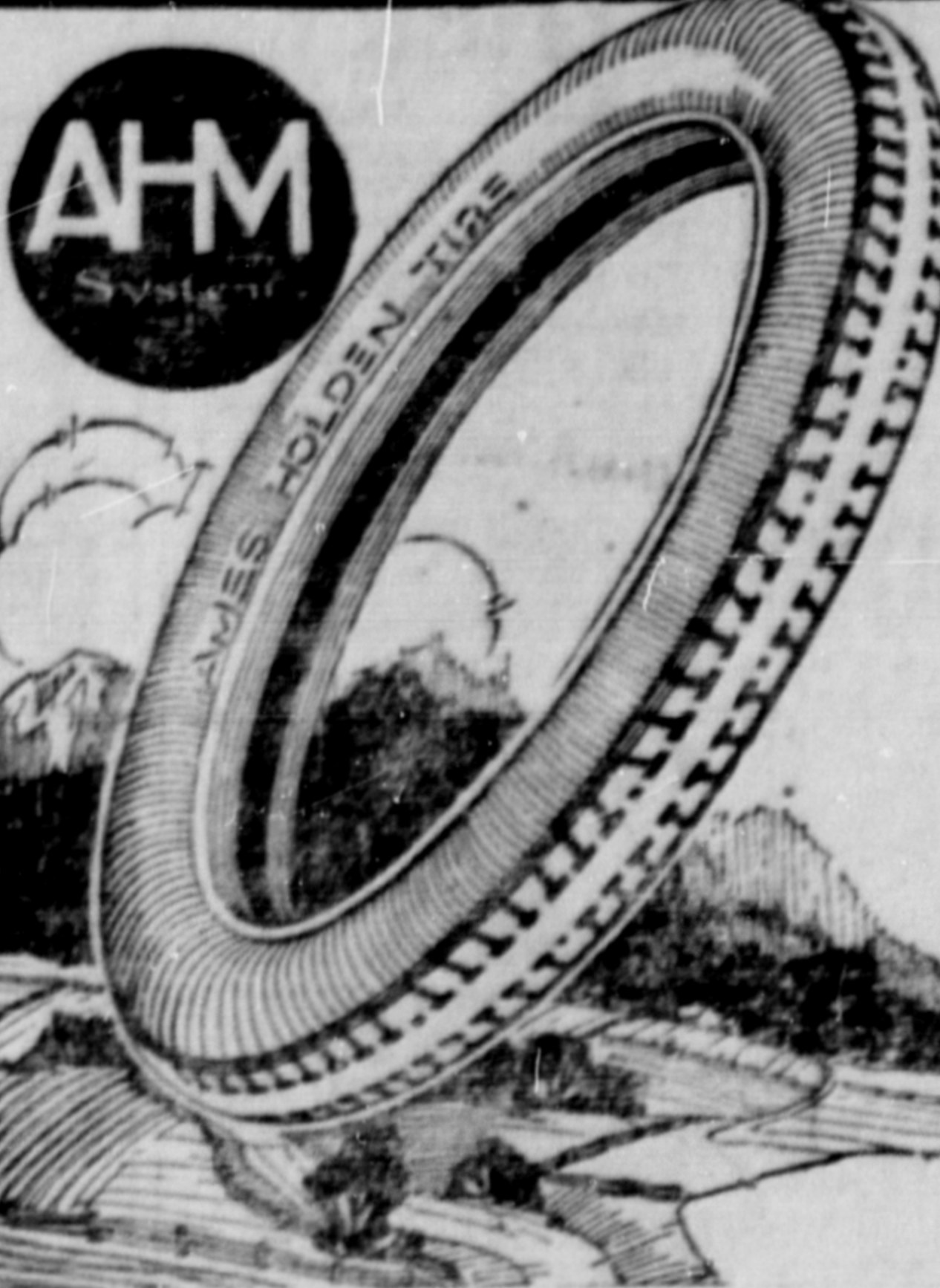
Superintendent N. B. Walton,
