LOG SCARCITY IN PROVINCE OF B. C.

Less Than 100,000 Feet Available Just Now in Water.

VICTORIA, Dec. 8.—The saw-mill industry of British Columbia has been hit by a famine in logs, and it is reported there are only 97,000,000 feet of all kinds of logs in the water.

Fir logs advanced \$1 a thousand this week. The run of the camp is quoted at \$11.50, while cedar has also climbed to \$22 for ordinary boom.

The scarcity of cedar is giving the shingle mills of the province no small amount of worry, and an investigation is being conducted by various interests to ascertain the quantity that is going to Japan in large cant form and in logs.

THE PAS, Man., Dec. 7.—Trapping—the big business of the north country for the next few months—is in full swing and many trappers are well established on their trap lines again.

Recently a number of fur buyers, with a sum of \$30,000 in cash between them, left here for the north to buy furs along the Hudson Bay Railway.

DUKE IS SUING.

BRUNSWICK, Germany Dec. 8. The Duke of Brunswick, the former Kaiser's only son-in-law, is suing the state of Brunswick for 1,200,000 marks with the interest which has accrued since the revolution, claiming that he has not received a penny from his estates although an annuity of 100,000 marks was agreed upon.

The Duke complains that he is unable any longer to pay his living expenses unless he receives the stipulated amount.
