

These are the two things badly needed at the north end of the island—the dyking of Delkatla Inlet and the building of the road to Port Clements. The dyking would save the province money and the other could be done a little at a time, first connecting the cannery at Woden River and then cutting across to the other highway. It would be much easier road building than any near Prince Rupert and little upkeep would be required on much of it owing to the gravelly character of the soil along the beach.


