SAID POLICE TREATED HIM IN ROUGH WAY

D. L. Stewart Laid Charge Against Constable Macdonald—Investigated Last Night.

Constable Alex. Macdonald of the city police force was called before the police commission last night to defend himself in connection with charges of rough treatment which had been laid by a man named Stewart.

Was in Fight.

It appears that Stewart had a fight with S. A. Corley and his law had been broken. He reached the hospital early one morning about three weeks ago without doctor's orders for admission.

Handcuffed.

The injured man was then handcuffed and taken to the hospital office, where he was released when the full circumstances of the affair had been explained.

The officer's theory was that Stewart would have laid no charge of this kind against him had he not entered the box in defence of Corley when he had been fined \$20 for assault.

"Nothing can be said against your action," said Commissioner Macdonald, "as nobody has corroborated the statements of either yourself or Stewart. In a case like this I am always going to take the policeman's word until the other's has been backed up. If we took one man's word against a policeman's all the time we would be having sessions of this kind every day in the week. Stewart has not substantiated his statement, and until he does the commission can take no further notice of it."

No Rough Stuff.

"However, whatever the circumstances of this case may be, there should be no unnecessary rough handling of men by the police, unless it is in self defense. Strong-arm stuff will get the force nowhere, but will only get the public against them."

Mayor Rochester concurred with Commissioner Macdonald's remarks both on the particular case in point and the general policy of police conduct in cases of this nature.
