**GRAND PRIX TO BE CONTESTED THIS YEAR**

Airplanes to Fly 1,500 Miles for Prize of 100,000 Francs

PARIS, Feb. 25.—The Aero Club of France has published the conditions under which the Grand Prix of France will be contested this year. The Grand Prix, the first of its kind to be run in France, is founded in memory of the late Henri Deutsch de la Meurthe and must be run during the first six months of 1921. The value to the winner is 100,000 francs. The course is laid Paris to Lille, Paris to Pau, Paris to Metz and return to Paris, a distance of 1,000 miles. Compulsory landings are provided for at each town in Paris and at Pau. The barns at Lille and Metz can be made in full flight.

Each airplane will carry 400 pounds of freight and dummies weighing 165 lbs. each, placed as passengers will be installed.

The race is exclusively for French owned-machines piloted by French aviators.
