JURY SYSTEM IS IN DISREPUTE SAYS EDMONTON LAWYER

EDMONTON, May 3.—That the jury system of this country had fallen into disrepute and that instead of jurors today being men of intelligence and honor and standing for good British fair play, they were often found to be of far different calibre, was the contention of N. D. Maclean in the supreme civil court in his address at the close of the jury trial in which C. E. Stone, of Vermilion, and the C.N.R. were the litigants.

His remarks drew from Mr. Justice Ives the following comment: "I think Mr. Maclean is broader in his statement of the jury system than he intended to be. In my opinion it is all right and has not come into disrepute. Juries are drawn from a wide territory and the men are necessarily of different calibre and at times their is room for considerable complaint about the appreciation that some juries have of the oath of their office."

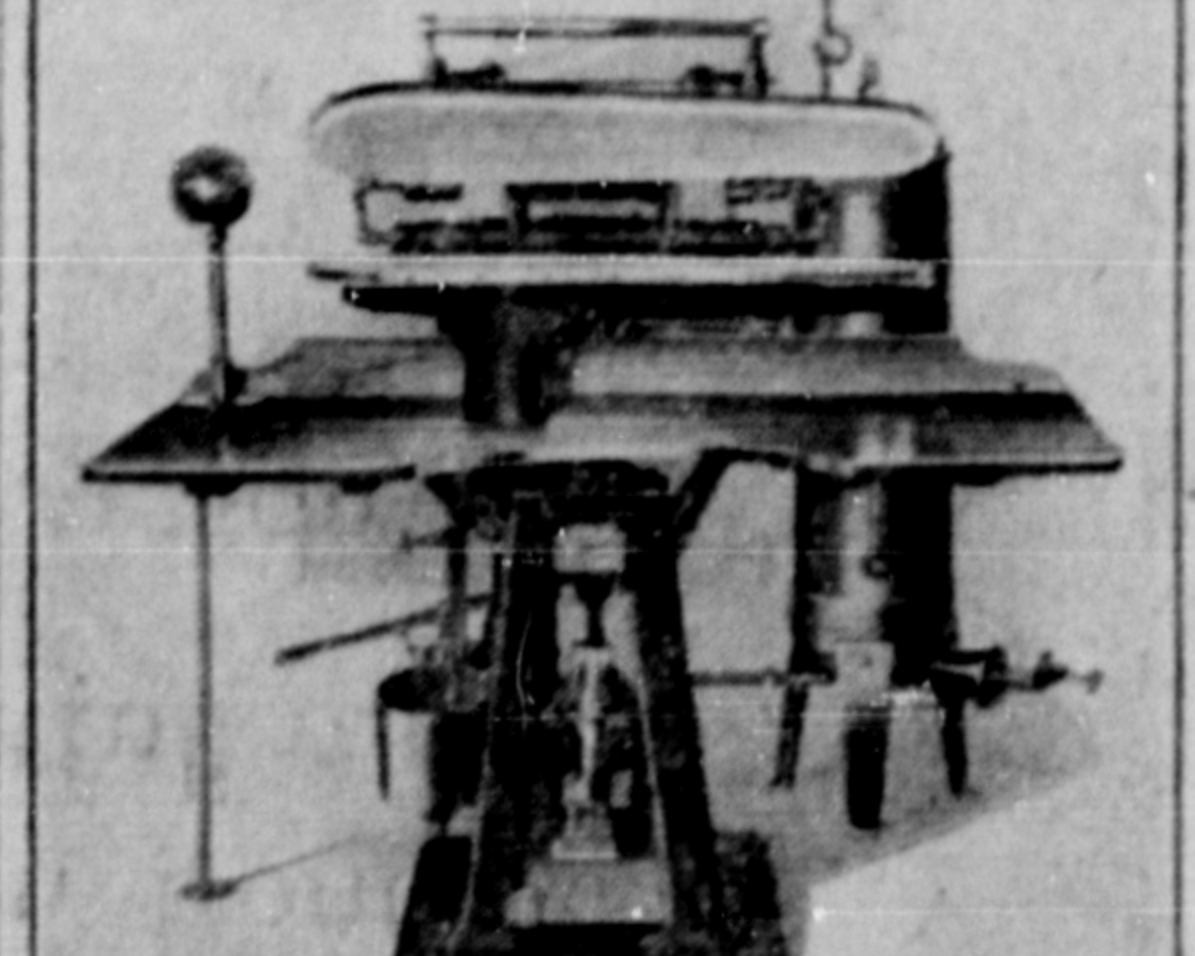
