## Bond Sale is Good Omen.

The selling of sufficient bonds to warrant proceeding with construction of the Prince Rupert Pulp mill is a good omen. It is the first step necessary in bringing the industry here. It cannot come here without water, however. That is an essential. We like the businesslike way in which the concern is going to work and it looks as if they really meant to establish the industry if they get the encouragement.

Prince Rupert people, we take it, are just as keen as anybody to see the pulp industry established here. There may come a time when we have no shipbuilding going on. If we have a pulp mill operating then, we shall not feel the loss of the other big payroll so much. We all want the pulp business. It will be for us to back up the local management and give them every possible encouragement.

## Bonar Law Resignation Is Very Important.

Only a few days ago an article was published showing that as long as Lloyd George had the backing of Bonar Law, there was no danger of the British Government being upset. While he has not lost that support, the resignation removes it as an active factor. It may not weaken the Government but there is danger that it will.

## World as Crazy As Before War.

The world is just as bad as it was before the war, according to Sir Philip Gibbs, the noted war correspondent, story writer and lecturer. There has not been that change for the better which was expected:

Sir Philip might go one step further and say the world is worse than it was before the war. The fighting spirit is in the air. People go to war on less provocation than they did formerly. It has become a habit. The spirit of tolerance is less in evidence.

The war was necessary. It could not be avoided, apparently, but we have to pay the penalty for the long period of training in killing each other and for the spirit of hate and hostility engendered at home. There were compensations, of course. Lessons have been learned, many of them valuable, but we doubt if the compensations would have been sufficient to justify the awful sacrifice had we not been forced into the conflict.

## Work Shut Down on Hudson Bay Railway.

Work has shut down on the Hudson Bay Railway because of the shortage of funds of the Dominion Government. At one time money was poured out like water and there could be but one result from such lavish expenditures. Now we have to pay the piper. The Government has been absolutely forced to economize or get out of office.

We believe they may be right in shutting down new construction work on railways. Certainly it is useless to build new railways until those now in operation are equipped. The G. T. P. will never pay running expenses without cars. We can understand shutting down construction, but we cannot understand neglecting a railway which already has the business offering and allowing that business to go to foreign railways. There is no economy in running the business of the country that way. It is the method of the wrecker rather than of the builder of business.

The time used is Pacific Standard, for the 120th Meridian west. It is counted from 0 to 24 hours from midnight to midnight.

The table given is for Port Simpson but the time for Prince Rupert varies only a few minutes on some days and on others is the same. The range of the tide may be computed as 5 per cent greater at Prince Rupert than at Port Simpson both at springs and neaps. Therefore the rise in the Prince Rupert harbor is slightly greater than Port Simpson.

The height is in feet and tenths of feet above the average level of lower low water.
