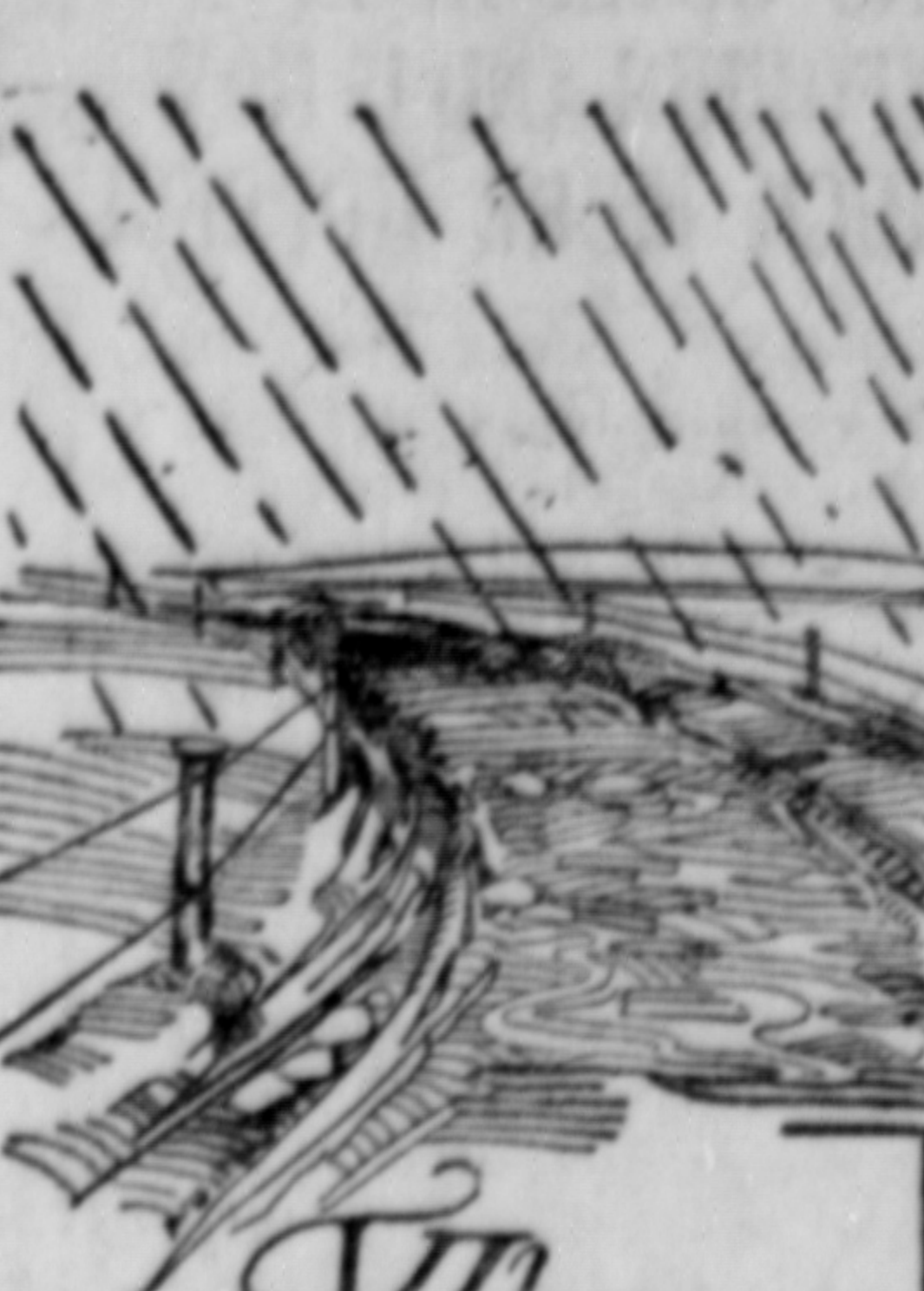

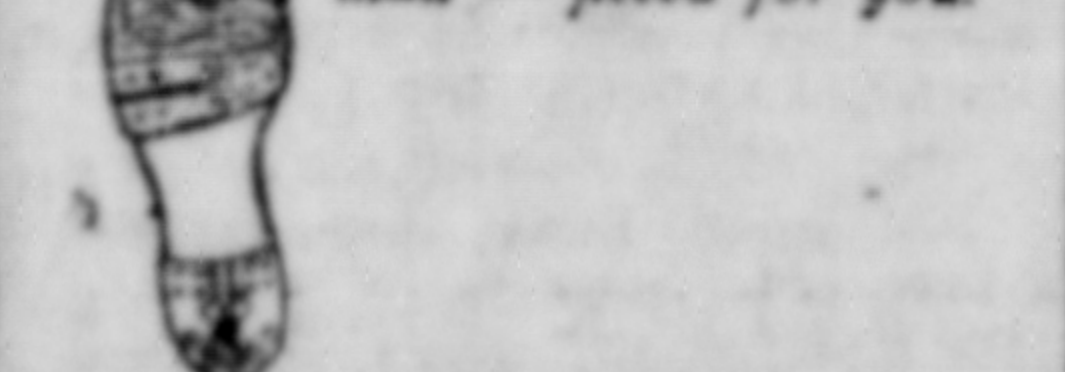

MEETING OF UNEMPLOYED

City Council to Be Asked to Provide Four Days a Week Work For All.

Two hundred persons, half of which number are actually unemployed, were present at the meeting of unemployed workers, men and women, which was held last night in the McIntyre Hall. The situation was thoroughly discussed and preliminary organization was arranged with a view to obtaining relief. J. H. Burrough called the meeting to order and was chosen temporary chairman. W. Ormsiaw later being selected permanent chairman. E. Maynard was chosen secretary. A committee of four comprising W. Dickens, J. Webster, Owen Dickson and W. Ormsiaw, was selected to interview the city council to ascertain what it proposed doing towards relieving unemployment this winter. The committee was also authorized to ask the council to provide four days a week work for all unemployed at the prevailing rates of wages. It will also ask that it be recognized as the only committee representing the unemployed in the city so that overlapping and duplication of effort may be prevented. The names of all the unemployed present at the meeting were taken down and W. Dickens and W. Stewart were assigned to be on duty at the Central Labor Council office from 4 to 9 every evening to take down the names of all those out of work who present themselves. WAR AGAINST FISH ENEMIES

Alaskan Scientists Say Dolly Varden Trout and Sockeye Sea-birds Must Be Destroyed.

SEATTLE, Dec. 12.—War on Alaska terns and Dolly Varden trout is declared by federal fishery officials. Shotguns will be unfettered, for the tern and the Dolly Varden trout are marked for slaughter because of their predatory habits in feeding on tender salmon fry in Alaskan rivers. This destructive appetite was observed by Dr. Winn, field superintendent of the United States bureau of fisheries who has just returned from an inspection of salmon spawning grounds, his tour taking him to the vicinity of Mount Katmai.

Explains Conspiracy

Superintendent Winn explained the conspiracy on the part of the terns and trout as follows: The tern is a black-headed seabird and they flock up some of the salmon rivers in droves, apparently in league with the Dolly Varden trout. It seems that the latter swim close to the bottom of the stream and began feasting when a school of yearling salmon passes over them en route to the open sea. The trout at the bottom of the stream forces the salmon school to the surface, where the terns, hovering overhead, swoop down upon them. Between the two great destruction to the young salmon results.

Federal Agents

With Superintendent Winn on his trip were a party of federal agents and fishery men, this latter industry largely financing the expedition. It is thought that canny boats will be equipped with shotguns and plenty of ammunition to war on the tern, and other means devised to curb the appetite of the predatory trout. During the trip it was found that fish are again swarming the lakes in the Mt. Katmai region, these waters having been devastated of the bany tribes as a result of the eruption of Katmai in 1912. The federal party went within 20 miles of the volcano and observed smoke issuing from the crater and sulphur fumes in the air.
