JAPAN COMPETES IN PACIFIC TRADE

Building Palatial Liner to Compete with C. P. R. with This Coast.

Determined not to be left behind in contesting for Trans-Pacific passenger travel with palatial liners, the Nippon Yusen Kaisha is believed to be placing an order for an ocean vessel that will vie with the best on the Pacific, says the Victoria Colonist. Incoming liners bring word of the plans of the Japanese line, whose officials refer to the new ship as a "super-Empress," and indicate that she will be built at a Glasgow shipyard. It is said that all the materials for the steamer necessary to its construction have already been assembled on the Clyde, and that she will be completed by the end of next year by the British builders. When finished she will be assigned to the Victoria and Seattle route from the Orient.

Plans for a ship of this nature were laid down by the Nippon Yusen Kaisha some time ago, but owing to the serious financial depression existing throughout the whole world, and especially among the Japanese shipping lines, were suspended for the time being. Now, however, the situation is brightening in that respect.

LIQUOR LEGISLATION PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

TORONTO, July 15.—By order in Council the Sandy Bill will come into effect on the morning of July 19, concurrently with the Dominion legislation which prohibits the importation of liquor into the province of Ontario.

Through the bill "short-circuiting" becomes impossible at the same time as non-importation becomes effective. The bill was introduced to prevent orders being placed outside the Province and filled by breweries within the provincial borders. In this way the moving of beer or liquor in Ontario is made impossible, other than that intended for Government dispensaries or people entitled to handle supplies.

"The passing of the order in Council means that Ontario is now in a position to go legally "dry" on July 19.

CANADIAN TARIFF UNDER DISCUSSION

Democrats Will Urge Largest Possible Freedom of Trade.

WASHINGTON, July 15.—Because the effect of the recent emergency tariff law in some respects has been to increase the cost of living in the great cities and centres of population strong opposition is developing among eastern members of Congress to the agricultural duties provided for in the new bill for the permanent revision of the tariff. The proposed wheat duty of 25 cents, intended chiefly to shut out Canadian wheat, will encounter strong opposition. While this is lower than the present emergency rate, it is criticized by members from the cities as too high and sure to mean enhanced prices for wheat flour and bread.

House and Senate democrats in the forthcoming tariff debate are preparing to demand the utmost practicable freedom of trade between Canada and the United States. In fact the subject of the commercial relations with Canada will be one of the chief themes of the entire tariff debate in both houses.

RACING IN VICTORIA EARLY NEXT MONTH

Two Weeks With the Ponies Commencing August 6; Thoroughbreds in Vancouver.

VICTORIA, July 16.—Turfmen and followers "of the ponies" are beginning anxiously to count the days until the thoroughbreds make their appearance once again on a Victoria track. Two weeks racing are ahead, the first to start on August 6, and the second week, after the two weeks' interval imposed by law, to take place in connection with the September Agricultural Fair of the Willows. The horses will be engaged at Vancouver on Saturday next, and four weeks racing altogether will be enjoyed over there by the Mainlanders.

Plenty of Horses.
Two hundred and sixty thoroughbreds are now in Vancouver waiting for the opening and when the cry, "they're off," is heard for the first time this year or a Vancouver track it is expected that there will be no less than 500 ponies stabled ready to take part in the racing. Will Rob Leighton in charge of the arrangements it is a foregone conclusion that everything will be handled in first class style. The string of horses includes a number of well known first-class gallopers, including some owned by Mr. Brothour of this district and the followers of the sport of kings will have the opportunity of welcoming some of their favorites in the saddle, among whom will be the crack jockey, Riddell and Matthews.

Pari-Mutual.
Those who like to have "something on" will have to be content with putting it on by machinery, pari-mutual betting being the only form of mild gambling to be allowed, and there need be no fear of welching as the Royal Canadian Mounted Police will be in charge of the machinery by which one's little bit will be won or lost.

Todd McAvoy, the popular turf man of Victoria, will be over at the Mainland tracks in the capacity of paddock judge, and he says that he will have a bunch of passes to distribute to any local sportsmen who go over there to take in the racing.
