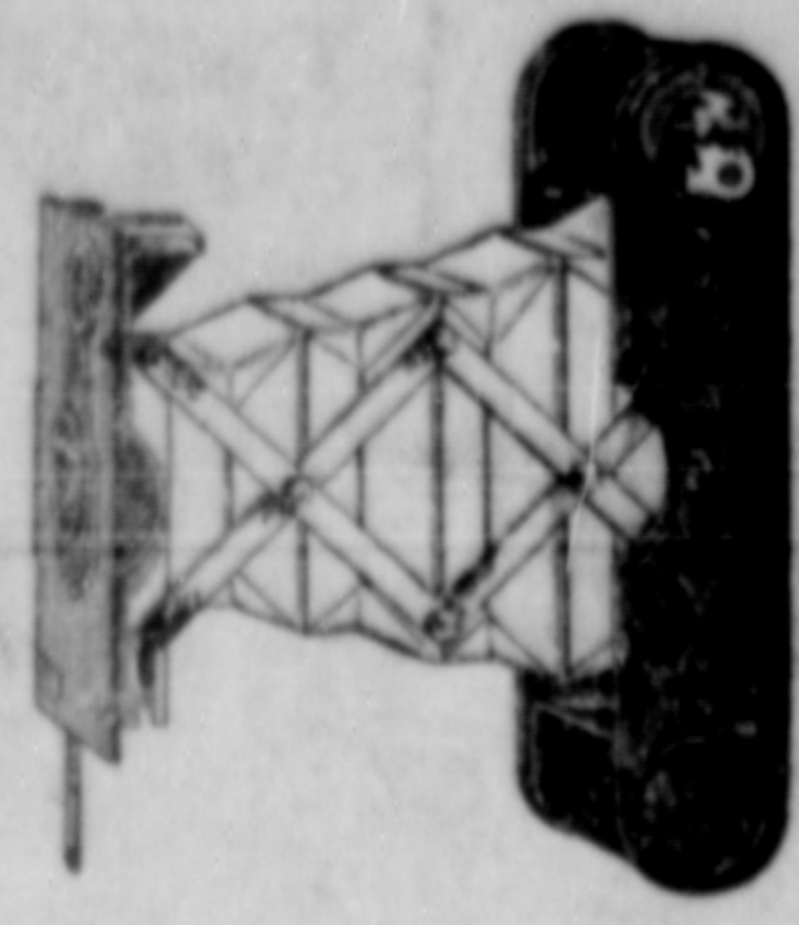

MATRIC EXAM RESULTS OUT

VICTORIA, July 16.—Of 1546 pupils taking the matriculation examinations in the province in June, 694 passed in all subjects and 394 supplementals were granted.
