POLICE RAID COCK FIGHT

One Hundred and Ten Men Arrested After Six Fights had been Witnessed

TORONTO, Mar. 6.—In a silent, swift thrust by the police 110 sportsmen were trapped by a squad of fifty police in a cock pit arena watching a game cock fight in the building of the National Conduit plant Sunday morning.

It was the largest raid carried out by the police in many years—and not one man is believed to have escaped the police net.

The descent of the police net came as a surprise to all the spectators, even the look-out man perched in a station on the roof of the building overlooking the "pit" to warn the gamblers of a raid, did not get a chance to sound an alarm before the police had smashed their way into the building. He was caught after he jumped off the roof.

Arrests Numbered 110

Every man in the place—110 of them—was arrested and taken to Claremont street police station in patrol wagons and service cars guarded by squads of police. The police motors made several trips and it took nearly two hours before the last of the fight spectators was locked behind the bars of Claremont station.

In the gathering were men from almost every walk of life.

There were many sportsmen from outside points, Hamilton, Bradford, Oshawa, Galt, Niagara Falls and as far as Chicago, but the majority were Torontonians.

Seized 33 Game Birds

The police seized thirty-three game birds. Five were dead, having met their fate in the pit. Many of the birds were spurred with sharp steel spurs strapped about their ankles. Some of the birds were brought to the city and are said to worth up to \$1,500.

When the police swept into the place they found a miniature wooden arena erected about the pit, held together by bolts and
