FOTOS CHILDREN LEAD AT M'GILL STUDY LANGUAGES

Miss Helen Fotos and Brother John Make Great Records and Both Win Scholarships.

The pass and honor list of McGill University, Montreal, at the recent examinations has just been received in the city and shows that Miss Helen Fotos and her brother John, children of T. Fotos of this city and former students of the local high school, have been brilliantly successful.

Out of 273 students in First Year Arts, Miss Fotos has taken second place on the list, winning the Annie Mackintosh prize with first class honors in Latin, French, German and Greek. Her brother John wins first class honors in the same subjects, being awarded the Classical and Modern Language Scholarship.

Helen took first place among all competitors in Latin and John third; Helen first place in French and John second; Helen first place in German, John second; both tied for first place in Greek.

These successes reflect honor upon the ability of these young students as well as credit on their teaching in Prince Rupert's schools.

ALBERTA VETERANS HONOR STUTCHBURY

Local Visitor Held in High Esteem by Edmonton Returned Men.

Howard Stutchbury, Alberta trade commissioner, who is at present in this city, was to have been the recipient at Edmonton last Sunday of a noteworthy presentation by the returned soldiers of Alberta in the form of an illuminated address. On account of the absence of Mr. Stutchbury the presentation had to be postponed.

While not a returned man himself Mr. Stutchbury was untiring in his work for the men returning from France, both before and after the armistice. To quote one passage from the address which the returned men prepared: "His duties were a labor of love and no returned man ever appealed to him in vain." The illuminated address, which is a real work of art, was drafted by the Alberta executive of the G. W. V. A. and the fine sketching and color work were executed by the Stafford Studios in Calgary.

HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS WILL STUDY WORK OF ROBERT L. STEVENSON

Next term the text in English literature for the preliminary course, Junior Grade, in the high schools of B. C. is to be changed. Sir Walter Scott's "Ivanhoe," which has been studied for many years, will be replaced by R. L. Stevenson's "Kidnapped." Official announcement to this effect was made by Dr. J. D. McLeab, minister of education, last week along with other changes in the various public school curricula.
