PRINCE GEORGE STAGES GREAT CHINESE SCRAP

Rival Groups Meet in Field and Beat Each Other up With Clubs.

The smouldering fires of hatred broke out into violent conflagration this morning when Chinamen started a fight after leaving the police court, says the Prince George Citizen. A case against Li Kow and some of his associates, charged with gambling on information laid by members of the Chinese Nationalist League, was adjourned owing to the absence of witnesses. This case, it is alleged, is a sequel to the assault charges recently laid against members of the Nationalist League. As a reprisal members of the league are reported to have laid charges against the club which goes under the misleading name of Chinese Free Masons, for gambling.

Following the adjournment of the case in the police court the divided factions left the court in a body. Whilst proceeding down the walk to George street, one of them passed a few remarks about somebody's ancestors which precipitated a young riot. City Solicitor P. E. Wilson and W. P. Ogilvie, for the defendants, were coming up behind. They took sufficient interest in their clients to take a hand in separating them vigorously. Mr. Ogilvie, who is an old boxing man and stands six feet in his stockings, with about the same breadth as the back of a cab, threw Chinamen all over the lot and the fight broke up with the contestants flying down George street to Chinatown for reinforcements.

Battle in Open.

A few minutes afterwards the battle was on in earnest on a high dry field, offering no cover, outside Garvey's barn, just off Third Avenue. Streaming out of Chinatown the warring factions met here armed with long bundle sticks and improvised weapons. The method of attack was singularly free from tactical niceties. They advanced upon each other crying defiance and casting blows upon the escutcheons of illustrious ancestors, meeting in a grand hand to hand conflict in which they booted their long clubs off each other's heads with whole-hearted effort and disregard of the consequences.

Gun was Used.

In Chinatown, at the opening of the battle, one better prepared than the others, opened fire with a revolver, wounding a Chinaman in the hand and leg. He was removed from the scene with his "blighty" to the city hospital, where he lies at this instant muttering strange passages in the Oriental tongue.

Hundreds of citizens gathered to watch the melee and assisted the mounted, provincial and city police in effecting the arrests of the Chinese. Many escaped, however, in the uproar, and are sequestering themselves in the Chinese quarters, where Chief Sinclair is looking for any of them who bear the mute testimony of battle scars. The field of conflict is littered with some heavy clubs, some of which are covered with the gore of the victims.

ACKROYD IS DISMISSED

This Action Taken at Special Meeting of Police Commission Following Suspension by Chief

W. S. Ackroyd, recently appointed police constable on the city force, was discharged at a special meeting of the police commission held yesterday afternoon. The discharge came as a result of Ackroyd having been found intoxicated in one of the city hotels at 3 o'clock yesterday morning by the chief of police. The constable was suspended yesterday afternoon and at the meeting of the commission the suspension was endorsed, resulting in the dismissal of the officer. The meeting was held at 5 o'clock and Mayor Rochester and Commissioner Myhill Jones were present. A GREAT BOOM IN MATRIMONY

During 1920 No Less than 400,000 Couples were Married in England

LONDON, April 16.—During 1920 nearly 400,000 couples were married in England and Wales, a considerable increase on 1919, which had beaten all previous records. Of the extent of the "boom" in matrimony one may get some idea when it is remembered that for the year preceding the war the annual average was only 280,000. Indeed the 300,000 mark has only been passed twice—in 1919 and 1915.

Signs are not wanting, however, that the crest of the matrimonial wave has passed! Nuptially, as it is termed by some statisticians, apparently reached its apex in the summer of last year, for the figures for the last quarter are decidedly lower than they were in both 1915 and 1919. It is a well-established rule nowadays that there are fewer marriages in the winter than in the summer months; but this notwithstanding it seems probable that 1920 will hold the matrimonial "record" for many years to come.
