WHAT TO DO -- HOW TO DO IT.

Measuring Ice.

YOU can't weigh ice as you would meat, but you can find out how much it weighs in the following manner:--Take a tape measure and measure its length, breadth and thickness. With these three dimensions compute its cubic measure and divide by thirty. The result is its weight.

You cannot, of course, get the exact amount, but you can find out about how much you are short weighted every day. That is--Suppose that today you had a piece of ice that measures 8 by 18, or 288 cubic inches. Divided by thirty you will find that your ice weighs a bit over twenty-five pounds, while you may be paying for thirty pounds.

Clean Brown Leather Bag.

Brown leather bags may be cleaned by rubbing on a thick lather of pure white soap. Apply it with a sponge, rub hard, let it remain on a few minutes, then wipe dry with flannel cloth and polish with vaseline; rub this in with bare hand; rub very hard; don't use too much and wipe off well and your bag will look nice.

Destroys Silver Fish (Bug).

To destroy these silver fish cover bits of cardboard with boiled starch paste poisoned with arsenic and lay them on the book shelves, behind mantels, in bottom of drawers, &c. But of course take great care that this paste is not within reach of children or pets. Or dust bookshelves liberally with common Persian insect powder of pyrethrum.

Fireless Cooker.

A homemade fireless cooker will prove very useful. Use a large wooden butter-pail. For packing to hold the heat, use fine, dry sawdust. Hot bricks may be used instead of "soap stone." A closely covered lard pail is used to hold the food. Be sure the top of pail is covered also. The more closely covered the inside and outside pails, and the thicker the padding of sawdust, the more satisfactory your cooker will be. You can cook all kinds of vegetables that need to be boiled, also meats, steamed pudding and steamed breads, and you will notice that the flavor will be much better. Before putting your fireless cooker together the food must be boiling hot; kettles must be filled so as to leave no air spaces. The "bricks" or "soap stone" must be very hot.

Cleans Silver.

Many kinds of silver polish are injurious to the silver. Buy whiting, moisten with water or ammonia, and you will have an excellent paste for cleaning sil-

ver. Spread a paper on your table, rub the article to be cleaned with a cloth dipped in the paste, let stand until dry and polish with a soft cloth. Wash in hot soapy water, rinse and dry.

Timely Tips.

To make shoes last longer varnish soles with copal varnish and let dry. Fruit stains on linen should be removed with glycerine and left for about an hour; then wash the stains in warm, soapy water; repeat the process if necessary.

Children's Teeth.

Here are a few hints about the children's teeth:--

The teeth are very important. As soon as the children are about three years old teach them the habit of washing their teeth after every meal. Buy them a small sized brush and a mild tooth powder or paste.

Candy is bad for the teeth. A small piece after meals is plenty. Do not let children break hard things, such as nuts or thread, with their teeth.

Take them to the dentist as soon as it is necessary. Make children like the dentist instead of hating him.

Cornstarch for Economy.

To make an inexpensive chocolate pudding and to make one quickly boil cornmeal until it thickens. Then stir in sugar and cocoa. It makes a rich and delicious pudding.

Fresh Grapes.

Do you know how to keep grapes fresh? The French put away fine clusters in a dark, cool place each with its own stem thrust upward through the cork of an inverted bottle of water. This involves a rack to support the bottles upside down.

Another way to keep grapes fresh is to seal the end of the stems with hot paraffin, wrap the bunches in tissue paper well twisted up to exclude the air and lay them carefully in layers between sheets of cotton batting.

Lemon Lore.

Lemons ought never to be allowed to dry up. It is so simple to keep them plump. Some people recommend packing them in a cask in dry sand, arranging so that no two lemons touch. This for a quantity. For the usual half-dozen on hand at once it is better to cover them with cold water, weighting them to keep them down. The water should be changed twice a week.
