Five carloads of halibut are being prepared for shipment at the fish packing houses this afternoon and will fill all available refrigerator cars. Besides these five carloads several smaller boats had to sell at a sacrifice on account of their being no further cars available.

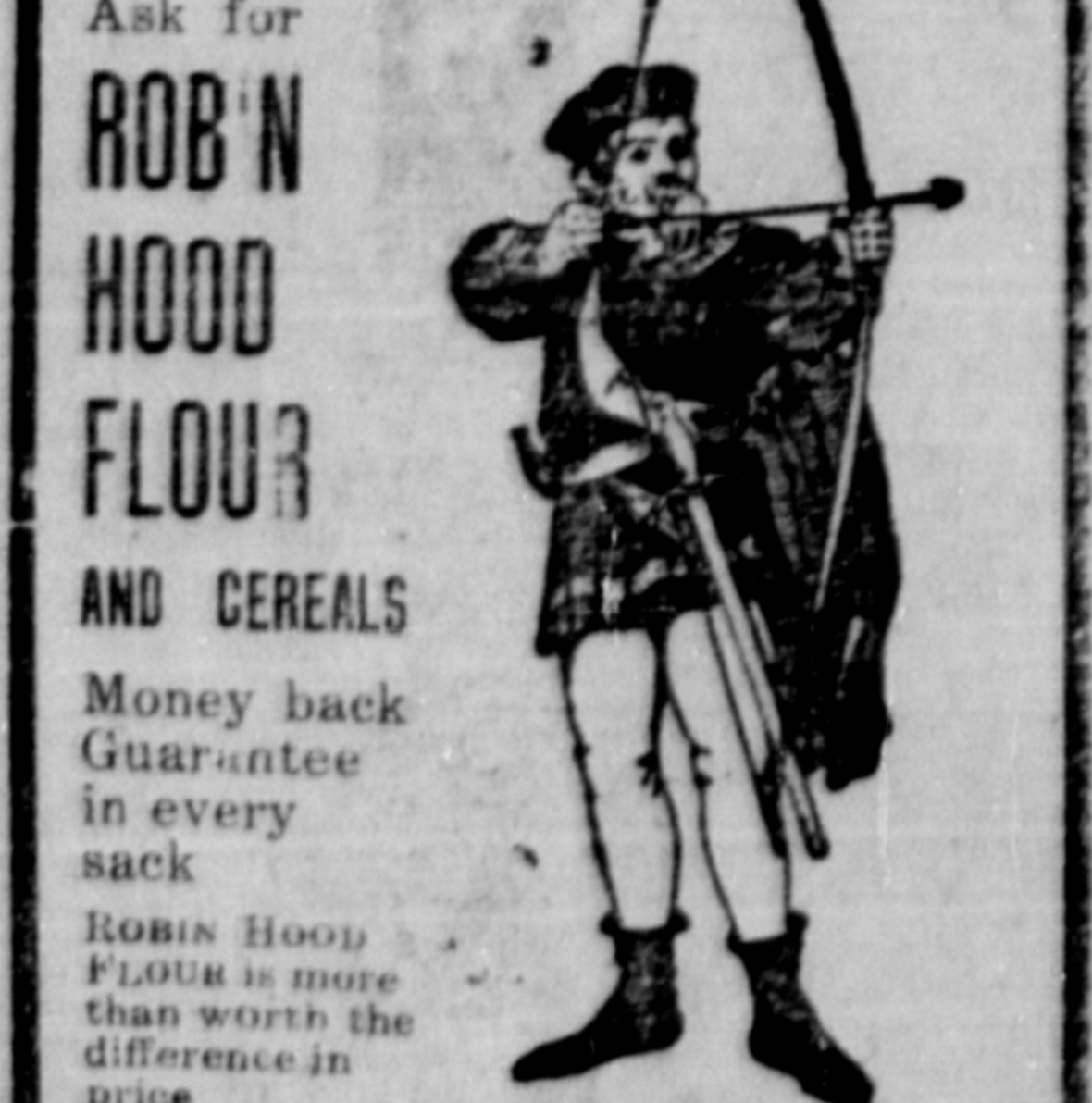

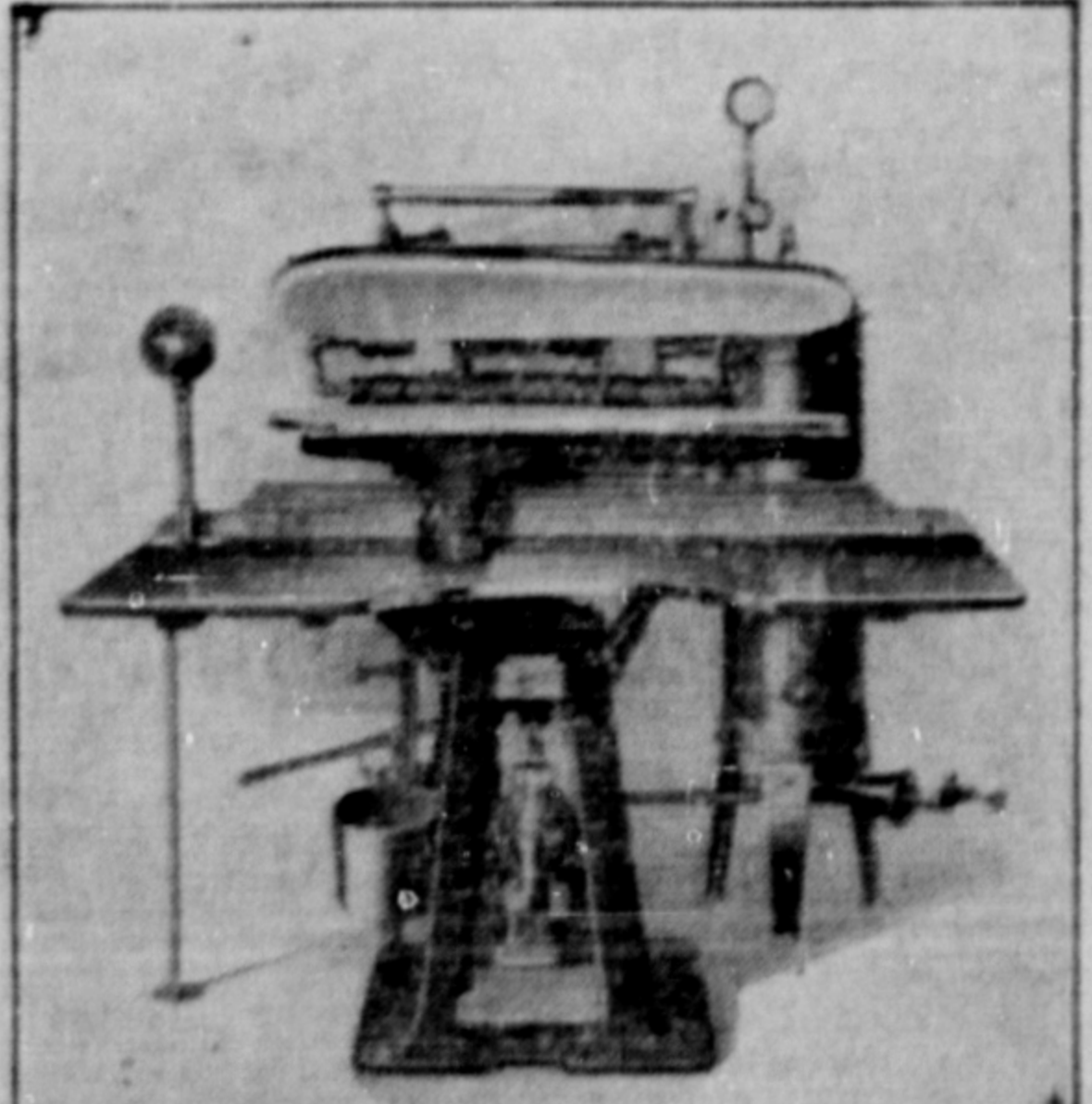
