Drydock Junior Football Team Wins Championship Beating Athletics 4 to 1

The Drydock football team won the championship in the Junior League as a result of a victory over the Athletics last evening, beating their opponents by a score of 4 to 1. Early in the game, with the down grade in their favor, the Drydock team made it clear that they had cinched the lead, leaving the field at half time with the score 4 to 0 in their favor. In the second half the Athletics were easily held down to a lone goal, which was scored by Mackintosh on a penalty granted against Garner. Thus the final count was 4 to 1, with Malcolm Lamb's "Wasps" on the short end. The teams were as follows:

Drydocks — Hughes, Garner, Eldred, Roy, Cole and Currie; Thompson, Warrior, Erskine, Kirby and Butters.

Athletics — Frizzell, Barry and Curtis; Hamilton, George Mitchell, and Davidson; Hill, W. Mitchell, Mackintosh and Lamb.

With the whistle the Drydocks carried the ball into enemy territory but the fine head and foot work of Curtis and George Mitchell soon had the ball back over the line. More than once did the Shipyard forward line carry the leather down the field, before Eskine scored on a cross, which might have been cleared by Red Davidson.

Signs of Weakening.
Again the ball was returned to the lower end of the field when Frizzell had to do some sharp goal saving. Finally after a series of fumbles Davidson touched the ball over Frizzell's head as the latter was about to clear it and the Drydocks registered another goal to their credit. The Athletics' back division was now showing signs of weakening especially on the right half and Barry had difficulties in clearing and when forced to a corner Butters took the kick. It was well placed, but Warren sent it over the bar. On a throw-in Butters was called off-side and for the kick Hill of the Athletics got away to a fine effort but was forced to a corner by the close effective checking of Currie. The ball was well placed but the Athletics forwards failed to rally and the left wing allowed the ball to get down the field.

Following some natural ground play Kirby received the ball from his left and made no mistake in making the net sag with one of the best shots made during the season. To this player also was the next counter attack.

Nice Combination.
The ball was kept well field and some nice combination work was shown by Kirby and Butters with the latter swinging in some fine centres which missed their mark, however. Curtis carried the ball down the wing for the Athletics and worked his way to the sticks. The goalie came out and was beaten, but Curtis was stopped and the ball rolled slowly across the field and after grazing the far post was easily cleared. At this time Curtis was placing some splendid corner kicks but the Athletics forward line was off form. The game was called with the Athletics still pressing down the field.

Distinguished Themselves.
For the winners Currie and Cole showed up well on the half back line whilst Butters was the star of a forward line which showed great combined play. Erskine was also playing a good game at centre.

In the Athletics eleven George Mitchell continually menaced and checked the Drydocks and his stellar efforts in the second half especially kept his team on their feet. Curtis excelled himself whenever called upon to make the play. Frizzell in goal, although a little indecisive at times saved many extremely dangerous shots. Sid Thompson was referee with Harry Foote and James Mitchell assisting at the lines.

Sport Chat

A movement is on foot in local baseball circles to have Prince Rupert's star baseball team go south at the end of the month to play games at Vancouver and New Westminster for the championship of British Columbia. W. D. Vance, president of the association, and Harry Breen, secretary, have communicated with the president of the Commercial League in Vancouver to this end and a reply to the wire sent is expected soon. The possibility of going to New Westminster is also to be taken up. If the association is successful in making the arrangements a call will also be made at Ocean Falls to play there in response to the long standing invitation from the paper town. It is proposed to make the trip about the end of August.

It is generally felt that if Prince Rupert ever had a baseball team capable of competing with the strong teams in the larger cities of the province she has it this year. Two years ago the locals played very creditably with Wallace's, the champions of Vancouver, and although they lost on that occasion both games played were well contested. This year the city has as good if not a better aggregation between the various teams of the City League. The general support of the sporting public in this latest proposal of the Baseball Association should be forthcoming. It might also be possible for many of the fans to make the trip if negotiations could be suitably arranged between the Vancouver Commercial League and the steamship companies.

The first preliminary in the boys' pitching contest which is being staged by Gill and Clem will take place on Saturday night. There will be two classes—boys of 10 to 12 and 13 to 15. When the winners of these two classes have been selected, there will be a final for the city championship. A good deal of interest is being taken by the youngsters in the contest and many of the Junior and Juvenile League players are entered.
