### SUNDAY AMUSEMENTS SAME AS CHURCHES

LOS ANGELES, July 20.—Superior Judge Burnell held a unconstitutional Pomona's law prohibiting Sunday amusements where admission is charged.

Judge Burnell held that the law was "class legislation" as it permits churches to operate and take up a collection, which legally is the same as admission fees charged for any show.
