Threatening Letters
To Premier Oliver.

Today a dispatch from Victoria tells that Premier Oliver has been threatened in anonymous letters, one even going so far as to suggest death. Although such news is rather sensational, it is not so surprising in the case of "Honest John" as it might be if a similar threat were made to others. The premier is not a parlor politician who meets opposition with a suave answer and says that he will think it over. He is slow to make up his mind but once it is made up no amount of mere opposition is going to change it. When he makes a decision he is always ready to stand by it and will fight even his best friend, politically or personally, when he believes he is in the right. Thus he is apt to make enemies and bitter ones.

Not Likely They
Will Frighten Him.

Evidently some of his enemies are trying a new tack to have the premier alter his policies. They are trying to intimidate him by threats of physical injury but such arguments, compelling as they may seem, are not going to have much effect on a man of his calibre. He is not going to call out a bodyguard to watch while he walks down the street. He probably realizes what such cowardly threats really amount to for after all there is little possibility that such action as is threatened would ever be taken for it would gain no point if it was carried out. John Oliver possesses just as much physical courage as he has demonstrated he has political and mental bravery and such threats as these are not going to frighten him. That is sure.
