

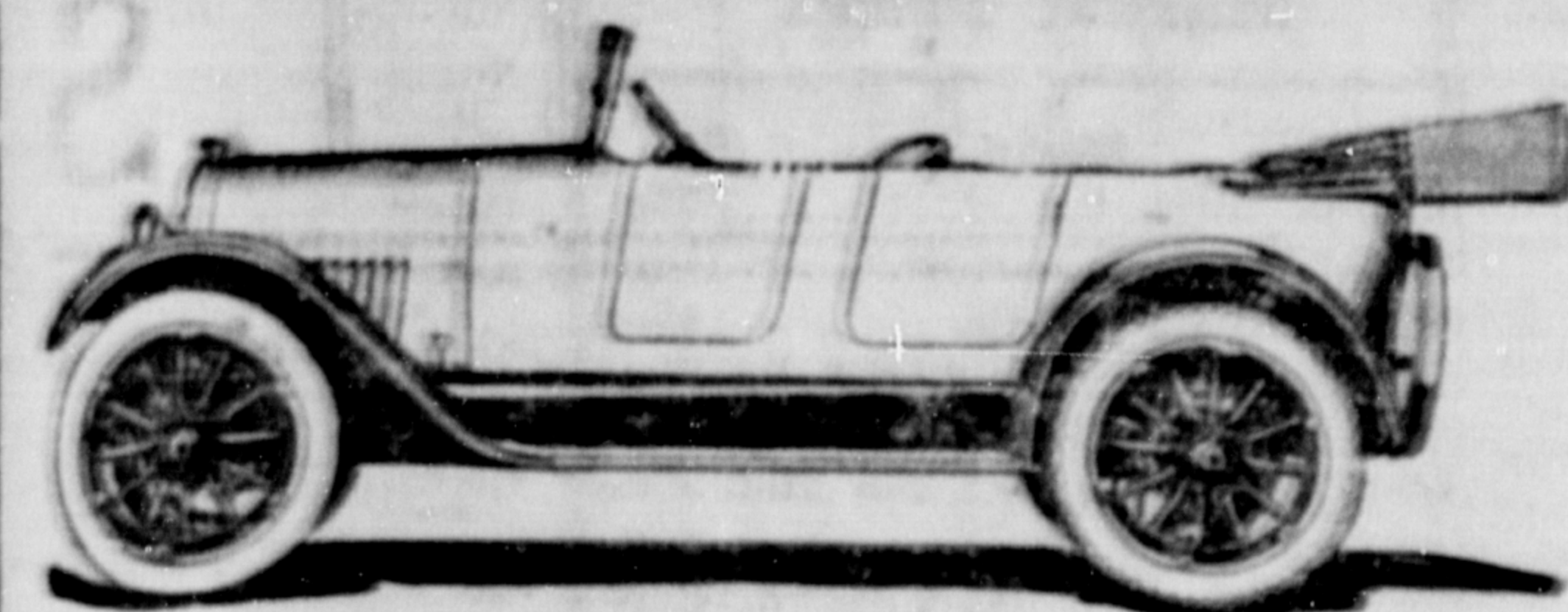

MINERAL RESOURCES NOT YET SCRATCHED

So Said Col. Crabb, Granby Vice-President, Who Visited Here Last Week.

Col. J. T. Crabb, New York, executive vice-president of the Granby Consolidated Mining, Smelter & Power Co., of Anyox, B.C., who was a visitor in Prince Rupert last week, declared that all the mining that had yet been done in British Columbia could not even be described as a scratch on the surface, in view of the widespread and extensive mineral deposits in that wonderful section of Canada. The colonel is enthusiastic regarding possibilities and is convinced that a golden future is vouchsafed the province.

"Copper is not the only mineral in British Columbia," the colonel said; "though it is rich in that mineral, it is quite rich in gold and silver and many other valuable minerals, including iron. If much has been taken out of the province, it is as nothing to what remains. Why, the country has not been scratched. It is very rich minerally. It must become a very rich country. I can only realize that for this Canada of yours there is a wonderful future."
