DENVER, June 17 .- The American Federation of Labor has renewed its repudiation of the International Federation of Labor and has also refused the request from Amsterdam that it reconsicer its refusal to affiliate with the European unionism movement. A resolution endorsing the One Big Union was also defeated at the convention today.
