**McLEAN PARTY VISITED CITY**

Arthur Stringer, Novelist, and J. Vernon Mackenzie, Editor, Looking for Copy

**TO FAMOUS ARTISTS SEEKING INSPIRATION**

A small party made up of one novelist, one editor and two artists blew in yesterday and spent the afternoon and evening here, leaving this morning on the fish special for Prince George. They were looking for local color, for unusual experiences and they have it today in their trip to Prince George in the fish train caboose.

The visitors were Arthur Stringer of Toronto and New York, well known writer and a frequent contributor to such journals as the Saturday Evening Post and McLean's Magazine, author Prairie Wife, Prairie Mother and other stories, H. Westop Taylor and W. V. Chambers were artists who made illustrations for the same magazines.

Magazine Editor

Possibly the most interesting man from the Prince Rupert standpoint was J. Vernon Mackenzie, editor of McLean's magazine, who as the editor of a national journal, is making a tour of the Dominion to find out conditions at first hand and to tell about them. He made only a flying visit, but in the time he was here he secured enough information to write most interesting impressions. McLean's have always been very kind to Prince Rupert and the same treatment is expected from the editor that has been given us by the special writers. While here they were taken out by G. A. McNicholl and E. C. Gibbons of the Board of Trade and shown the sights of the city, with which they were suitably impressed.

The party has several plans. Mr. Stringer wishes to ride on the cow catcher of an engine, but he is finding difficulty in securing the necessary permission. Then there is a proposal that they drop off the beaten track at Prince George and take a canoe up the river, going as far as Peace River Crossing. It is probable, however, that they will cling to the G.T.P., for they wish to see Mount Robson and Jasper Park.

The members of the party found many friends in this city. There were old college mates, friends of their respective families and friends of their friends all to be looked up. Mr. Mackenzie had a letter of introduction to Dr. Kergin, while Mr. Stringer found a college mate in Canon Rix and in O. H. Nelson a man from the old home town. Everywhere they went, it was evident to them that Ontario plays a large part in the life of this community, for there were people they knew and people who knew people they knew, everywhere they went.

**CITY CANNOT TAKE AWAY SURFACE WATER**

Appreciate Difficulties of Owners But Impossible Precedent Would be Established.

A request from Dybhavn & Hanson that the city take care of the overflow of water from the hill behind the Tent and Awning Building on Third Avenue that threatens to flood the basement of the building was last night turned down by the city council on account of the precedent which it was felt would be established if such were complied with.

The city solicitor was not in favor of the action in his report and the board of works recommended that his attitude be endorsed. Ald. Perry favored the city taking away the water if possible and Ald. Kelly and Ald. Parker also felt that it would be a good move but the precedent made it impossible at the present time. The city sewers could not handle it.
