A lease between Moreton Frew, en, owner, and the Prince Rupert Swimming Club was signed last night for the Sall Lakes and other property across the bay which gives the club control of the swimming grounds and utilities. The deal was made through the office of M. M. Stephens, the local broker.

It was decided at last night's meeting of the club to take a volunteer crew over next Sunday to rebuild the landing float at the mouth of the lake. The logs for this float have already been obtained. More sand will also be placed on the shallow bottom at the near end of the lake to provide for the youngsters. A tag day is to be held on May 28. The club now has \$129 in the bank and the city grant swells this to \$189. It is expected the result of the tag day will bring in another \$300.
